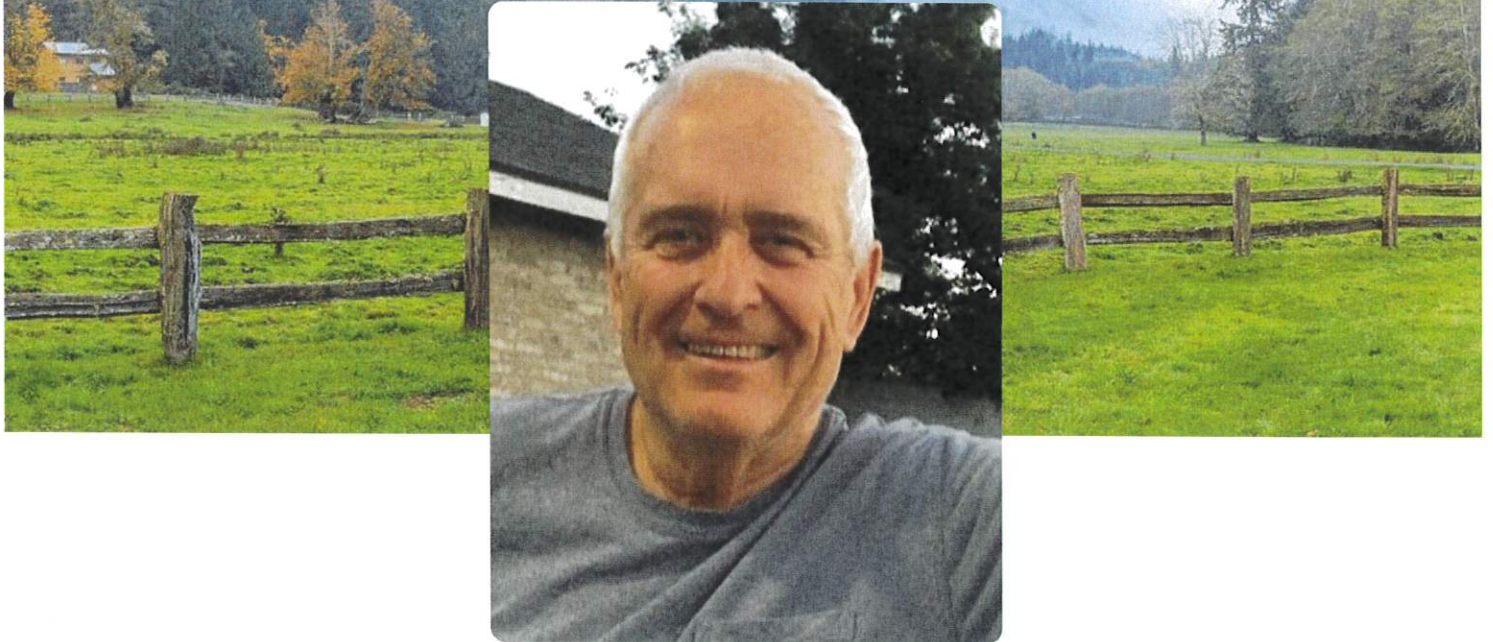

Ted White Kenison, husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, brother, uncle and friend, passed away quietly at his home in Santaquin on December 24, 2025. Ted was born January 17, 1953 in Ontario Oregon, in the elevator, on the way up to the maternity ward, the 5th of 8 children born to Elburn Thomas Kenison and Alleen Vale White. His early years were spent in Emmet, Idaho and Vale, Oregon, high school years were in Winnemucca, Nevada.

After high school he moved back to Ontario and was working as a farm mechanic, when he met his eternal companion, Linda. They met at an Institute Class and were married on Halloween, October 31 1975, together they raised six children. Ted spent most of his employed years working in steel fabrication and after 30 years of married life he and Linda moved to a small farm in Mona, raising alpacas and processing fiber. In 2018 they returned to Santaquin where Ted continued his love of serving family, friends and community.

A devoted member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Ted served as an Elder and then High Priest for many years.
