Public Forum - Bob Condor from the RAP Tax Committee wanted to clear up that wages can be spent with RAP Tax dollars. This discussion came up with the idea of hiring a part-time art coordinator.



Penny Reeves presented the award and read the following:

"Santaquin Mask Sewing is a group that started on Facebook at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. It was formed to bring together sewers, cutters, suppliers, and deliverers to provide local

first responders and caregivers with face masks, in the south part of Utah County. The group has been able to construct over 400 masks! The group consists of about 100 women in Santaquin but there were key players in the group that did much of the work. Kathleen Provstgaard saw a need in the area and contacted Rachel Cook who then helped form the group and coordinate the project. Rachel was instrumental in keeping the group going and she also created 3D Masks to donate. There were many others such as Natalie Hughes who spent a lot of time helping figure out the best way to make fabric masks and how to get supplies. When enough people were not sewing, she texted and called individuals. She asked them to sew 5-10 masks each and she got the ball rolling. Another wonderful helper was Andrea Lloyd. She has sewn almost 200 masks alone. Chyann Kindschy also made many masks and tons of bias tape. She offered to help in any way and kept sewing until there was no longer a need. Bliss Blackburn was there in the beginning and helped get the group going as well. All these women and many more have truly shown what it means to be a volunteer and have blessed the lives of many people in our community. Thank you for sharing your talents with those who have been on the front line of this pandemic".

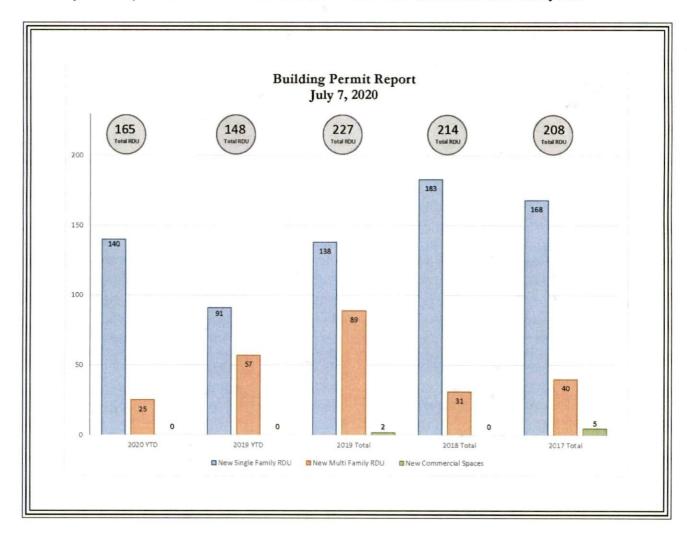

#### Summary:

RAP TAX Committee focused on the following:

- 1. Wanted to have one larger area/project. They supported improvements at Theodore Ahlin Park
- 2. Did not want to support projects that were "maintenance" focused. Considered that City responsibility.
- 3. Did want to support projects in Recreation, Arts and Parks.

Council Member Mecham expressed his gratitude for the RAP Tax Committee and their efforts on this.

Council Member Miller said he felt that discussions had in the RAP Tax Committee meetings were positive and productive and that this will bring a lot of positive recreation amenities for the community. Miller continued saying that he had a positive recommendation for the RAP Tax Committee's determination except for item four which was for museum building improvements. Miller recommended instead that the \$3,000 go to the Museum Board for their discretion on use but that RAP Tax dollars not be used for maintenance usage. Council Member Miller then asked City Manager Reeves to find the \$3,000 in the city's budget for light fixture replacements considered by the RAP Tax Committee.

Council Member Mecham asked why the city didn't spend the remaining \$4,000 and City Manager Reeves explained that this allows the Committee to save up for larger projects in future years and added that there was an additional \$5,000 that came in June bringing that balance up closer to \$9,000.

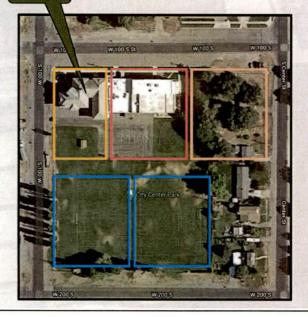
Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the New City Hall Proposal

City Manager Reeves reiterated the preliminary budget for a new City Hall and explained that as of July 3, 2020 all of the required steps for exercising the authority to obtain bond funding, as outlined in State Code, has been completed. Reeves continued explaining the pros and cons of each location for a City Hall and that out of the seven options, based on feedback and feasibility studies done by staff, it really comes down to two options – the Museum property and the Ercanbrack property.

Reeves then went over the advantages and disadvantages of Community Engagement for a new City Hall. If the Council were to elect to go the Community Engagement route, then Reeves recommended a third party carry out the process and not the city to make the process more professional and eliminate the perception of bias.

Council Member Mecham asked where the environmental analysis needed to be done for the Museum Option if that option was to be pursued and Assistant City Manager Beagley responded that it would have to be the entire Museum property as they wouldn't know exactly where on the property the City Hall would be placed.

Council Member Montoya asked what the advantages were of an USDA Loan and Reeves explained that you would have the opportunity to pay the bond over 30 years with lower payments but that would mean 10 more years of interest payments.

Council Member Hathaway said he was okay with Community Engagement but that from his point of view the people weren't going to buy into the Ercanbrack building because of so much distrust in the community from the last election. City Manager Reeves agreed and advised that if the Council elected to not do Community Engagement he recommended that the Council choose the Museum otherwise let the public decide.

The Council then discussed whether or not it was worth spending money on Community Engagement if the public was going to choose the museum and if it was more cost effective to just choose the museum property and not spend the money on Community Engagement for an answer to a question that they already know.

Finance Director Shirley shared that the Ercanbrack building was the clear choice from a financial standpoint because of 1) its cost per square foot was half the price of the museum site and 2) the space and ability for expandability that will accommodate the employment growth over the next couple of decades. However, Shirley stated, a resident shared some wisdom of what makes the most financial sense and business sense isn't necessarily what the community might want – and that's okay because a decision like this isn't made just from a financial standpoint but also from an administrative feasibility standpoint and a political standpoint. Even though the Ercanbrack building makes the most sense from a financial and administrative feasibility standpoint, politically it doesn't make sense to the citizens and if the people are willing to pay more for less and have the city take out more debt for future expansion then that's the direction the city will have to go.

Council Member Miller said that the Council needs to decide whether or not they believe the Ercanbrack building would be bought into by the public with all of the facts before them because otherwise it doesn't make sense to spend the \$50,000 on Community Engagement.

Council Member Hathaway said he didn't feel the community would buy into the Ercanbrack property despite the additional space and lower cost.

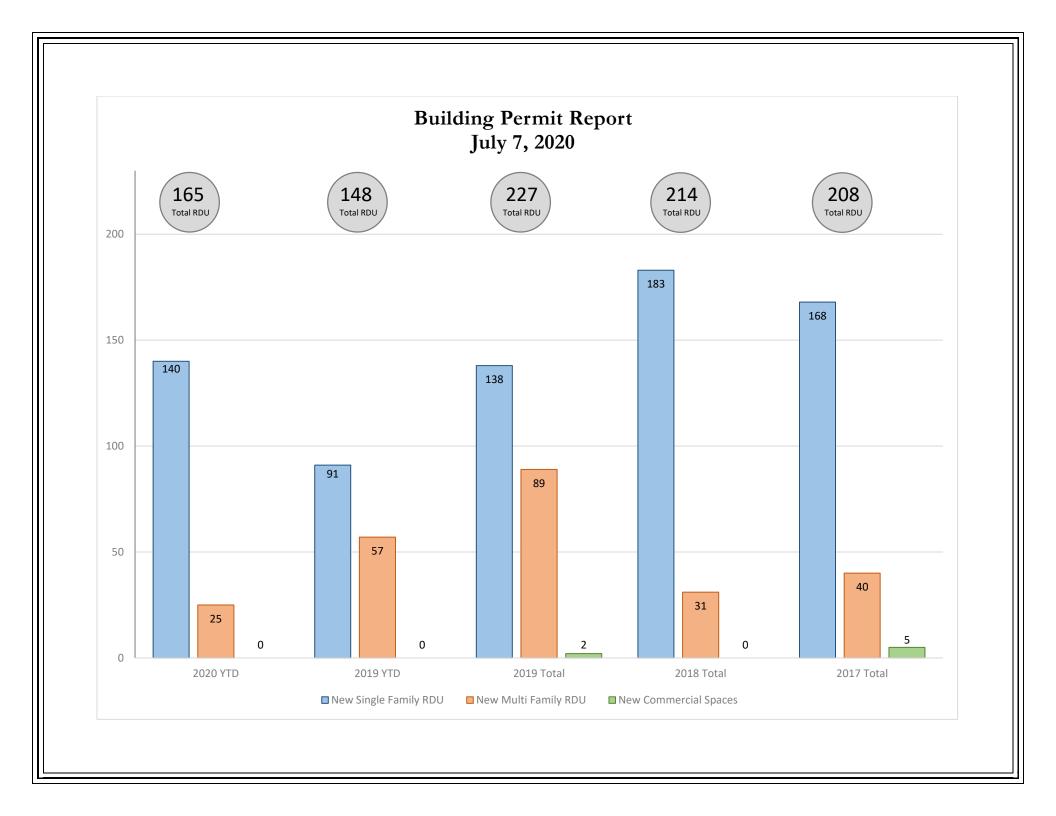

Re: Nebo School District & 500 West Annexation Petition

Santaquin City and Nebo School District are petitioning for annexation of property (3 separate parcels) west of Santaquin Elementary. The total property consists of approximately 19.80 acres and the proposed zoning for the property is Public Facilities (PF).

There are no current plans to construct anything or change the use of this property. The annexation will just merely incorporate a road which is the responsibility of Santaquin City and the Nebo School District land.

Annexations are governed by Utah State Code Title 10 Chapter 2 Part 4. At this point in the process, the City Council will need to accept or reject the petition for annexation. If the petition is denied, written notice shall be given within five days to the contact sponsor and the county clerk. If the petition is accepted, the City Recorder and City Attorney will need to certify that the petition meets all requirements within 30 days of the acceptance. If the petition meets all requirements, various notices will need to be posted and mailed. Opportunity will be provided for affected entities to protest the annexation petition. Any protest shall be filed no later than 30 days after the City Council's receipt of the notice of certification. If no protest is filed, the City Council may accept the annexation after a public hearing.

Re: Ordinance Amendment Regarding Building Materials in the Main Street Business

**District Zone (CBD, MSC, and MSR)** 

It is proposed that the Santaquin City Code be modified to allow concrete siding products as a primary exterior material in the Main Street Business District Zone.

This proposed change is being made in order to embrace some architectural styles that include a board and batten look which requires concrete siding products. These elements are consistent with the agrarian architectural style that the Santaquin City Code requires.

The Planning Commission has reviewed the proposed language and unanimously recommended approval.

After the Planning Commission meeting, I reviewed the language once more and have determined, and recommend, that some non-substantive language be added to provide further clarification. The proposed additional language is as follows: (Blue is the original proposed language and recommended by the Planning Commission. Yellow is the proposed additional language.)

c. Concrete siding products (i.e. hardie board) is considered a primary exterior finish but can only cover a maximum of 75% of each elevation, or 75% of the area defined in the table above, and must be accompanied by at least one other primary exterior finish.

Please refer to the attached ordinance for context and a better understanding of the requirements related to building materials.

**Recommended Motion:** "Motion to adopt Ordinance No. 07-01-2020 with the proposed modifications as presented, which allows concrete siding products as a primary exterior material."

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 07-01-2020**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SANTAQUIN CITY CODE TO ALLOW CONCRETE SIDING PRODUCTS AS A PRIMARY EXTERIOR FINISH IN THE MAIN STREET BUSINESS DISTRICTS ZONE, PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, CORRECTION OF SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, SEVERABILITY, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THE ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the City of Santaguin is a fourth class city of the state of Utah; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has specific authority pursuant to Title 10, Chapter 9a Utah Code Ann. (1953 as amended) to adopt a zoning plan including an ordinance and map which divide the municipality into districts or zones and within such districts to regulate the erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair and uses of buildings and structures and the uses of land; and

**WHEREAS**, the state legislature has granted general welfare power to the City Council, independent, apart from, and in addition to, its specific grants of legislative authority, which enables the city to pass ordinances which are reasonably and appropriately related to the objectives of that power, i.e. providing for the public safety, health, morals, and welfare; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council desires to amend Santaquin City Code Title 10 Chapter 15 to require landscaping in the front and side yards of every new residential dwelling; and

**WHEREAS,** the Santaquin City Planning Commission held a public hearing on June 23, 2020, which hearing was preceded by the posting of public notice in at least three public places within the City limits of Santaquin City, and which notice of public hearing was published in a newspaper in accordance with Section 10-9a-205 of the Utah State Code; and

**WHEREAS,** after the noted public hearing, the Santaquin City Planning Commission forwarded a recommendation to the City Council;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of Santaquin City, State of Utah, as follows:

#### **Section I. Amendments**

Title 10 Chapter 7 Section 9E is amended as follows: (underlined text is added, stricken text is deleted)

- E. Building Materials:
  - 1. Primary Exterior Materials:
    - a. Primary exterior finish materials shall make up at least the percentages of building elevations shown in the table below, after the transparent area, defined in this article, is deducted:

Building Area/Elevations	CBD	MSC	MSR
Single-family main floor facing a public street	n/a	n/a	50%
Single-family upper floors facing a public street	n/a	n/a	30%
Multi-family main floor	n/a	100%	100%
Multi-family upper floors	n/a	30%	30%
Commercial single-story buildings	n/a	50%	50%
Ground floor of a mixed use or commercial multi-story building	80%	80%	80%
Upper floors of a mixed use or commercial building visible from public rights-of-way	50%	30%	30%
Upper floors of a mixed use or commercial building not visible from public rights-of-way	30%	30%	30%

- b. Primary exterior finish materials shall be low reflectance, have natural textures, and utilize natural earth tone colors. Examples of permitted materials include: brick, stone, natural split faced block, or cut stone. The use of all glass exterior, smooth faced concrete block, prefabricated steel panels, corrugated metal, and EIFS (stucco) and masonry siding shall be prohibited as primary building materials. Nonmasonry siding is prohibited.
- c. Concrete siding products (i.e. hardie board) is considered a primary exterior finish but can only cover 75% of each elevation and must be accompanied by at least one other primary exterior finish.
- 2. Secondary Materials And Trim Materials: Secondary materials and trim materials shall complement the primary materials in texture and scale and provide enough contrast to be visible. EIFS materials may only be utilized for accents.
- 3. Accessory Structures: Accessory structures, such as gasoline pump canopies, utilities (gas, electric), trash enclosures and other accessory structures shall use the same architectural elements and types of materials and colors as the primary structure.
- 4. Material Colors: Material colors should consist of earth tones, e.g., muted shades of red or brown. The use of high intensity colors, primary colors, metallic colors, black or fluorescent colors is not permitted for primary exterior materials. Secondary materials and trim materials shall complement the primary material colors.
- 5. Wrapping: Where the two (2) sides of an extruding corner element are visible, materials and design elements shall wrap the visible corner and may only terminate at an interior corner location or the terminus of the visible wall plane.

#### **Section II. Severability**

If any part of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall, for any reason, be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such

judgment shall not affect, impair of invalidate the remainder of this ordinance or the application thereof to other persons and circumstances, but shall be confined to its operation to the section, subdivision, sentence or part of the section and the persons and circumstances directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the City Council that this section would have been adopted if such invalid section, provisions, subdivision, sentence or part of a section or application had not been included.

#### Section III. Contrary Provisions Repealed

Any and all other provisions of the Santaquin City Code that are contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

#### Section IV. Codification, Inclusion in the Code, and Scrivener's Errors

It is the intent of the City Council that the provisions of this ordinance be made part of the Santaquin City Code as adopted, that sections of this ordinance may be re-numbered or re-lettered, and that the word ordinance may be changed to section, chapter, or other such appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intent regardless of whether such inclusion in a code is accomplished. Typographical errors which do not affect the intent of this ordinance may be authorized by the City without need of public hearing by its filing a corrected or re-codified copy of the same with the City Recorder.

#### Section V. Posting and Effective Date

This ordinance shall become effective at 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 8<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Prior to that time, the City Recorder shall deposit a copy of this ordinance in the official records of the City and place a copy of this ordinance in three places within the City.

# A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EMPLOYER PICKUP ELECTION FOR ALL SANTAQUIN CITY FULL TIME POLICE OFFICERS UNDER THE UTAH STATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM (URS)

WHEREAS, In 2018, with a desire to create a strategic enticement to retain and recruit police officers, the Santaquin City Council elected to create a new program for its full time public safety personnel known as "Tier 2 Parity", in which Santaquin City would pay an equivalent retirement contribution for all of its full time police officers regardless of whether the officer was considered a "Tier 1" employee or a "Tier 2" employee as defined by URS; the only unique aspect being that the Tier 2 employees would have the difference in their retirement contributions (from Tier 2 to Tier 1) placed into a 401K retirement account; and

**WHEREAS**, during the 2020 legislative session, the Utah State Legislature made enhancements to the State of Utah's Tier 2 retirement program which took effect on July 1, 2020, in which participating entities needed to determine if their organization elects to pick-up member contributions for their Tier-2 public safety officers and firefighters; and

**WHEREAS**, Santaquin City desires to use a portion of the funds from its "Tier 2 Parity" program to pay for its public safety officer's member contributions, while continuing to place the remainder of the difference between Tier 2 and Tier 1 employees into a 401K Retirement account as was done previously;

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Santaquin City Council to:

- Approve and Submit the attached "Employer Election to Pick-Up Member Contributions: Tier 2 Public Safety and Firefighter Form" and thereby Pick-Up Member Contributions for Tier 2 Public Safety Officers; and
- To continue the Santaquin City "Tier 2 Parity" program by an amount reduced by the employer contributions through the aforementioned Employer Election to Pick-Up Member Contributions: and
- Establish an Effective Date for the aforementioned employer contribution to be June 21, 2020.

# **MEMORANDUM**

RE: The Hills at Summit Ridge Phasing Plan.

Salisbury Homes is proposing a change to the phasing plan of The Hills at Summit Ridge. The changes include the following: Phase D will be broken up into 3 phases, D-1, D-2 and D-3; there will be a new road added between Sawtooth Boulevard (Phase D-3) and Longview Road (Phase C); 9 lots will be removed from Phase D and added to Phase L and Phase B will be split into two phases, B-1 and B-2.

The code below explains the difference between a minor or major change to an approved preliminary plat and who needs to approve those changes. The code is found in 11-5-9 of the Santaquin City Code.

- A. Changes From Approved Preliminary Plats: It is recognized that through the final review process the design of street grades, stormwater facilities, and utilities may necessitate changes from preliminary plats approved by the City Council.
  - 1. Minor Changes: The Development Review Committee may, in their discretion, approve minor changes from approved preliminary plats. The types of minor changes contemplated by this section include legal description mistakes, minor boundary changes, reduction of the number of parcels, modifications to road alignments and items that should have been included on the preliminary plat. In such a case, the Community Development Director shall provide written notice to the Planning Commission and City Council of such changes at each body's next meeting.
  - 2. Major Changes: Major changes from approved preliminary plats, including an increase in the total lots within the development, reduction of approved lot sizes, change of public open space locations, elimination or increase in the number of roads, shall be submitted for review by the Planning Commission and City Council.

The reason that the proposed phasing plan is being reviewed by the City Council is due to the new road that is going in between Sawtooth Boulevard and Longview Road. The code above explains that an elimination or increase in the number of roads is a major change that must be reviewed by the Planning Commission and approved by the City Council. The Planning Commission has reviewed the proposal and has forwarded a positive recommendation to the City Council.

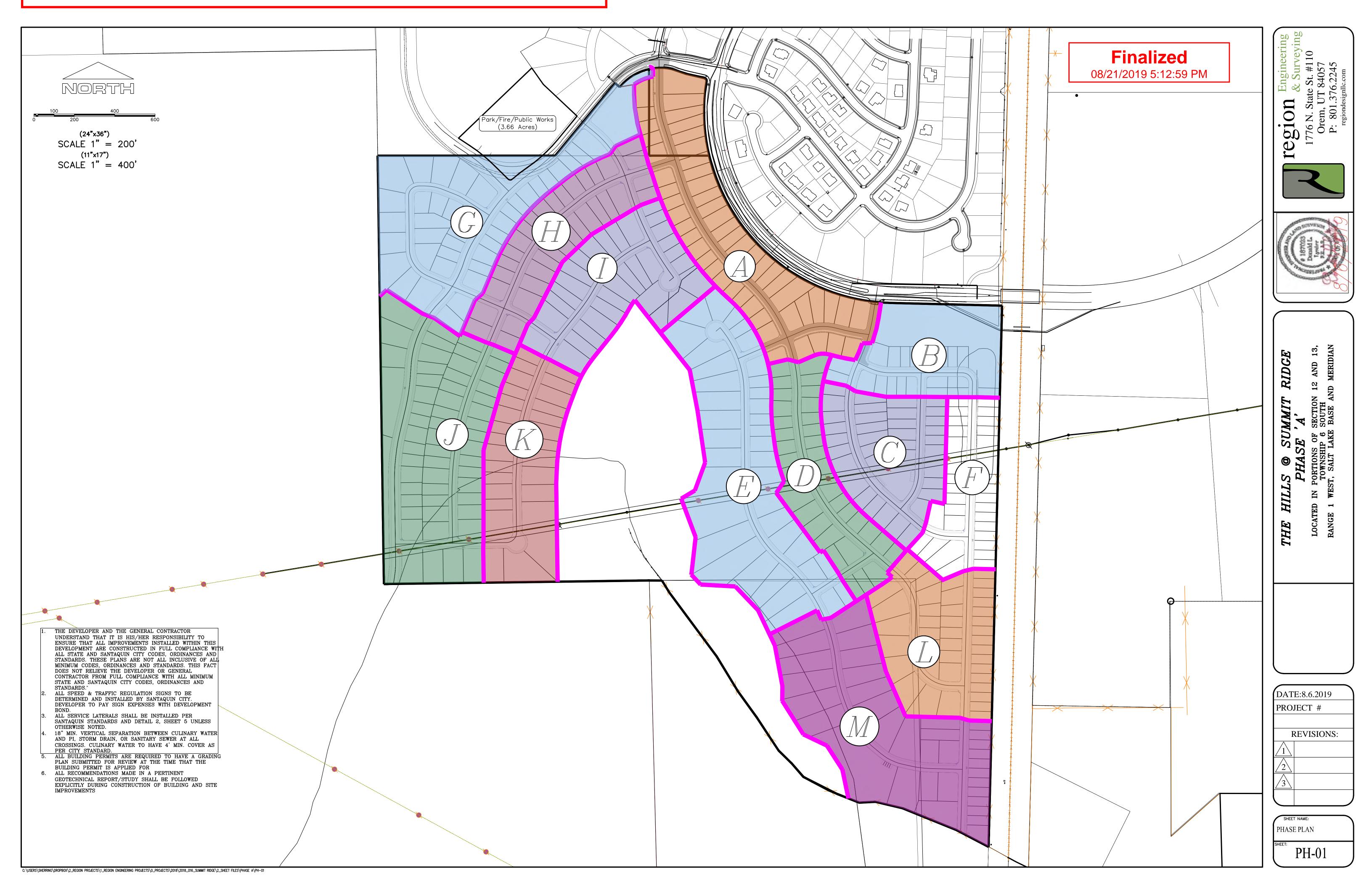

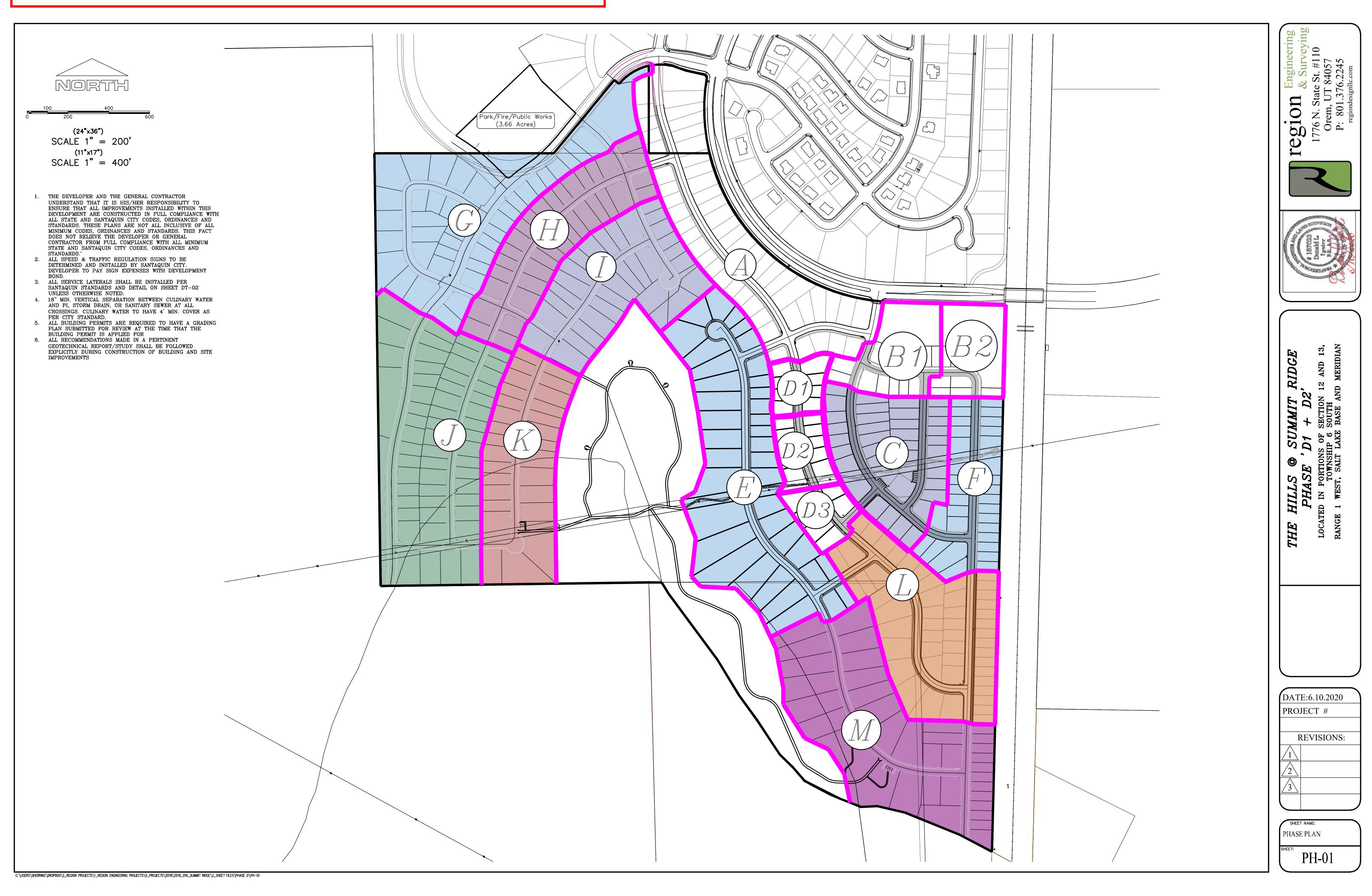

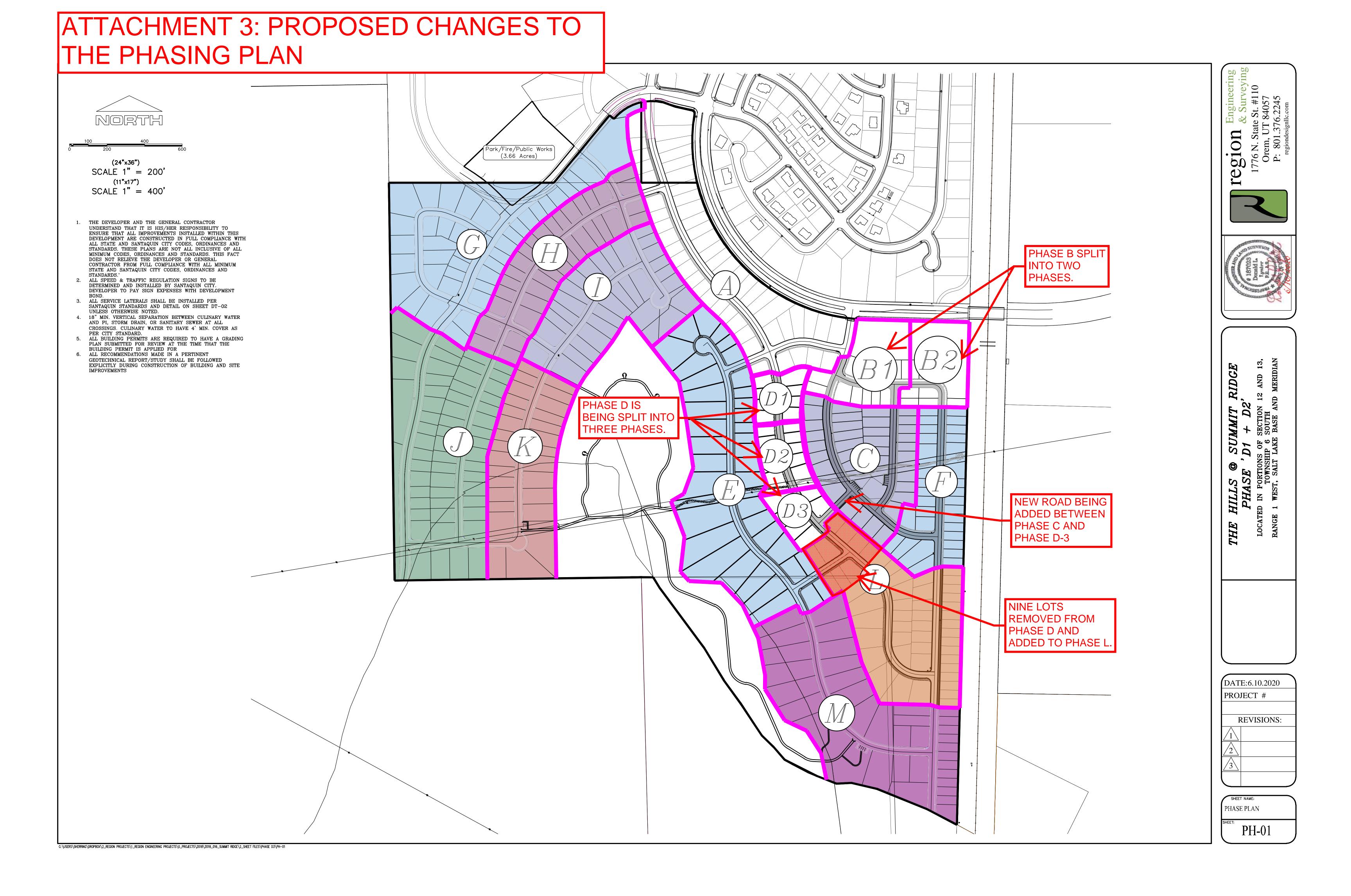

It will be open to boys and girls ages 10 -18 but we expect mostly girls to sign up. Creativity cultivates confidence. Confidence through creativity helps us become better problem solvers. Research has shown that creativity promotes longer life span, decreased negative emotions, and reduced stress and anxiety. Because not every child will excel or have an interest in sports, I would like to introduce the arts to our Santaquin youth. These classes will help them learn to love the process of creating and serving. All of our instructors are Santaquin residents, and we'd be buying all supplies from White Feather Rocks, so the use of RAP tax money will be reinvested into our own community.

The Lilly Pad Project plans to use these funds to hold summer classes in Santaquin, partnering with the recreation department to use a city facility as the classroom. We can teach up to 15 students at a time, and can open as many classes as needed based on participation interest. The money would be used to cover tuition,

instructor fee, and the jewelry making supplies. I am partnering with Jim and Loretta from White Feather Rocks on Main Street for all supplies. I will also be using their wire wrapping instructor, Clint Hamilton. Chelsea Rowley of The Lilly Pad Project will also be assisting during each session. The participants will be learning a new art form in wire wrapping. The items they make will be donated to The Lilly Pad Project, with the option to also take more items home for future donations. Not only will they make friends, learn a new skill, and be serving our community - they will also be supporting a local business. There is so much joy in creating art and crafting for a purpose.

Doors and Moulding also donated \$1K, with an additional \$1.3K from the Benevity Fund, \$50 from Amazon Smile, and \$800 through Facebook Fundraisers. We are run by volunteers, with no paid staff, so 100% of donations goes directly to funding the bereavement kits that are then distributed throughout Utah through hospitals, mortuaries, and birthing facilities.

#### Financial Update

As of July 3, 2020, all of the require steps for exercising the authority to obtain bond funding, as outlined in state statute, have been completed.

Santaquin City now has a one-year window to close on bond funding.

If there is a desire to seek USDA-RD bond funding instead of a private market bond placement, an Environmental Analysis will need to be completed. This is site specific.

Choosing a location is the next step.

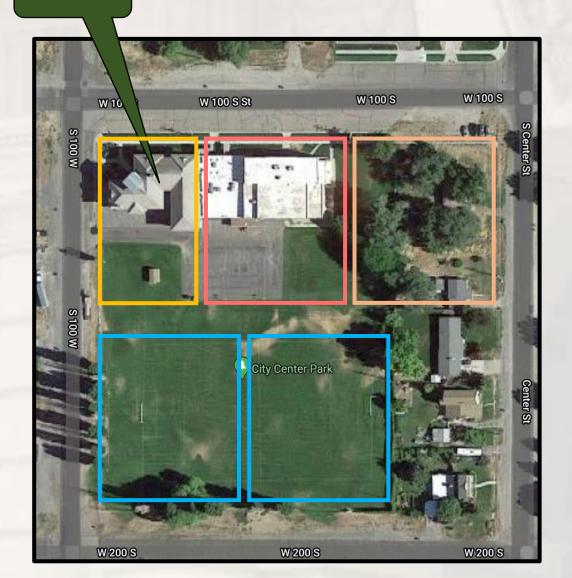

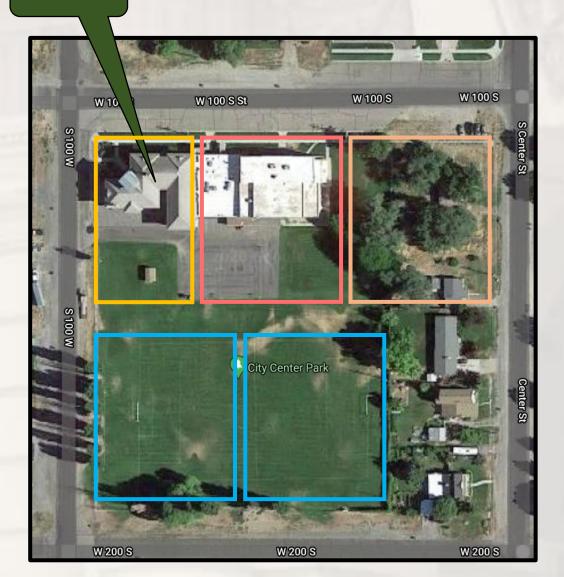
