PUBLIC FORUM, AWARDS, & APPOINTMENTS

Public Forum

City Manager Reeves explained that some of the participants will be speaking for their 5-minute allotment via telephone in addition to those who are speaking today in person.

Kelly Robbins came to speak on the Countryside Estates development. Kelly is concerned with the lack of space in the current dead-end street and while this hammerhead turnaround is supposed to be temporary she wanted to share that her family who owns the land on the would-be through street does not plan to sell that land in the next 25 plus years.

Stacia Cook lives directly across the street from the proposed Countryside Estates development and expressed her concern for the lack of space that would be created in the dead-end street for turnarounds for both school buses and garbage trucks and what that would mean for the safety of the children in the neighborhood.

Suzy Loftgren came to speak on the Countryside Estates development and expressed that she also was concerned with the three homes on the street would not provide enough turn-around space that would be dangerous for the children. Suzy also was concerned that the traffic study was conducted by the developer himself and not by a third-party which she believes is a conflict of interest.

Bryce Loftgren expressed his concern with the Countryside Estates and shared how in his profession as a UPS driver that backing up is an extremely dangerous driving activity that make up more than half of the accidents in his company. Bryce shared how he believes that this dead-end street with three more homes on the street will create more hazards than what currently exists. Even if this hammerhead turnaround is allowed by code, planning commission members have expressed concern with them and have even alluded to prohibiting them so the city should do it now rather than later.

Tammy Bentley wanted to ask about the possibility of a stop sign at the intersection near Apple Valley Elementary.

Ed Bentley expressed his concern that the crosswalk in front of the Apple Valley Elementary is not painted and it creates a hazard for their special needs child.

Miller participated via telephone and wanted the Council to take into consideration the comments made in the public forum thus far and reiterated the point that this temporary dead-end street is not really temporary as stated by the property owner Kelly Robbins and is creating more hazards and danger for both her children and the children of her neighbors.

Award Highland Drive/Canyon Road Intersection Design to Jones & DeMille Engineering

City Manager Reeves explained the background to the need improvements to the frontage road along Highland Drive/Canyon Road.

Council Member Montoya motioned to award a contract to Jones & DeMille Engineering for the Highland Drive/Canyon Road Intersection Design, in an amount not to exceed \$35,000.



REPORTS OF OFFICERS, STAFF, BOARDS, AND COMMITTEES

City Manager Reeves -

- This has been a busy week coordinating with federal, state, and local officials to keep citizens safe during this time of health concerns amid the COVID-19 outbreak. The city stands ready to serve and commented that amid these concerns the water in the city is safe to drink.
 - Chandler Miller stood up and asked if the water is good why can there be more homes on the proposed Countryside Estates development street that could possibly affect the water quality. Reeves explained that this development would provide more water flow and would add an additional fire hydrant station.

Community Development Director Bond -


- There are a number of public hearings in the various boards that are coming up and the city is ready to begin working on solutions for electronic participations so that citizens can have their voices heard.
- Mayor Hunsaker asked how many employees the city had again and City Manager Reeves said
 that there are nearly 50 full-time employees and with part-time and seasonal employees factored
 in that number is around 250. Reeves continued that the city is finding work for those employees
 whose jobs are being delayed or impacted COVID-19 to keep the city productive and not create

financial hardships on those employees while encouraging those who are not feeling well to stay home to protect the health and wellbeing of the city workforce.

NEW BUSINESS & ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS

Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Approval of the Countryside Estates – Plat E (including the acceptance of right-of-way dedication)

Community Development Director Bond outlined the development proposal, the zoning, and the process that has occurred so far. The issue at hand is the dedication of the portion of the hammerhead turnaround for city right of way so that there are no property disputes with the proposed lots.



Council Member Bowman said she did not understand why this proposal is being put forth when it does not seem advantageous to the citizens in the surrounding area. City Manager Reeves responded that when a city gets a proposal they have to follow a process regardless of feelings towards the project or developer. If the proposal meets city standards and code, Reeves continued, then there is an obligation on the city's part to put the proposal through the process of approval which has brought this before the Council.

Kelly Robbins came up to speak and asked if the hammerhead turnaround was sufficient for a fire truck to turn around and suggested the city look into banning them in the future. City Manager Reeves responded that this hammerhead turnaround meets International Fire Code (IFC) but if the Council wishes to provide stricter rules moving forward then they are able to do so through ordinance.

Council Member Montoya said that the concerns about children's safety was the reason why she voted against the code change that made this development possible. Council Member Bowman asked if this decision could be revisited. City Manager Reeves responded that the city could not retroactively change city code and any change to the Council's decision would be considered a "Taking" and the city would be both financially and legally responsible.

Council Member Montoya asked developer Derek Palfreyman to come up and share his views. Mr. Palfreyman expressed his concerns with current residents driving on private property, that included the future development, to do turnarounds in the dead-end street and said that this proposal would improve the street so that there would be no driving on private property as well as water quality improvements.

Council Member Montoya asked for the dimensions of the hammerhead turnaround and Community Development Director Bond responded that it was 82' by 24'.

Council Member Mecham asked the City Manager to explain the legal and financial implications of the Council not approving a proposal that meets its own standards. City Manager Reeves said that the city would be legally and financially liable for damages to the developer.

Council Member Miller asked if the Council was to entertain the option of purchasing the property what it would look like. Derek Palfreyman said that his third lot would be priced around \$120,000 to \$150,000 if the city was to consider purchasing it.

City Attorney Rich said to the Council that whether or not they agree with the code that is currently in place, the developer put in his proposal that was in accordance with code and denying that proposal when it meets city standards puts the city at risk for damages. He further recommended not "tabling" the discussion as that exposes the city as well.

City Manager Reeves clarified that the discussion could be put on a "continuance", which would automatically put the item on the next Council agenda, which could at least give additional time to explore more options.

Community Development Director Bond asked if the developer came to the table could purchasing the lot become more of an option. City Attorney Rich responded that it did not seem that the developer was open to that from his comments but they could go that route if they desired. Council Member Mecham expressed his concern with the city unnecessarily purchasing a property and the associated re-engineering costs. Council Member Miller responded that he acknowledged that as a good point but wondered if the city could put a price tag on safety.

Motion: Council Member Miller motioned for a continuance of the Countryside Estates Plat E Subdivision approval and accept right-of-way dedication for consideration of safety.



Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Approval of 400 East Main Street Plaza Design

City Manager Reeves and Community Development Director Bond presented the design for the corner plaza in the new grocery store development as laid out below and asked for Council input or desired changes.



Council Member Mecham asked what kind of barrier would be between this corner plaza and Main Street. City Manager Reeves said as the plans stand it would be just a curb similar to everywhere else on Main Street but the city could look into more options like safety barriers. Mecham expressed concern that larger trucks would pose a safety hazard to this proposed public space and asked staff to look into options for greater safety. Council Member Hathaway proposed that maybe a two-foot brick wall could provide a greater safety barrier or something along those lines.

City Manager Reeves stated that staff would take these comments into consideration for a revised corner plaza design.

The Council expressed their admiration of the design. City Manager Reeves asked for Council direction on priority of the elements of the design while keeping costs in mind.

Discussion Regarding a Possible Skate Park

City Manager Reeves explained that a skate park is in the Recreation Master Plan in Stone Hollow Park and it is in the IFFA and IFFP so the city is collecting impact fees that are eligible to be spent on a potential skate park. Reeves continued saying skate parks are expensive but a more cost effective option could be a pump track as shown below.



There is a vendor in Beaver currently demonstrating pump tracks and is offering them half price around \$29,900 but the problem is that impact fees are not eligible for non-fixed assets i.e. assets physically connected to the ground. The pump tracks in Beaver for sale are moveable separate pieces but that this could be paid for out of the recreation capital project funds. An advantage for the pump tracks are that they can be customized and expanded.

Council Member Hathaway reported on the Recreation Board meeting the previous night and shared his thoughts that if the pump track proved itself popular enough that perhaps a smaller skate park could be considered in the future.

The work meeting was called to order by Mayor Kirk Hunsaker at 5:30 p.m.

Assistant City Manager Beagley offered an invocation

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Discussion Regarding the Outward Mindset Training

City Manager Reeves introduced the Outward Mindset book that each city department city is currently reading and discussing for training. Reeves asked if the Council wanted to participate in this training and discuss the book together and the Council expressed their desire to do so in the coming work sessions.

Discussion Regarding Utah/Juab County Line Relocation

City Manager Reeves showed a map of the proposed county line relocation and described the benefits to the city. Staff has been meeting with officials from both Juab and Utah County and in the future a joint public hearing and resolution is required. Reeves explained that there are no residential areas affected by the county line relocation.

Discussion Regarding Parking at the Harvest View Sports Complex

Mayor Hunsaker expressed concern that since its opening, the Harvest View Sports Complex has had a shortage of parking and vehicles have been parking in the grass. City Manager Reeves brought up two related items that would tie back into the Harvest View parking issue.

- 1) There is a new development in the works next door to Harvest View that would have a connector road brought in that could be attached to additional parking at Harvest View and be widened if the city partnered with the developer. Assistant City Manager Beagley explained that if the city partnered with the developer then the developer could pay for half of the cost plus ten feet.
- 2) The Summit Ridge Development Agreement has contractual language that says the developer will provide the city a certain amount of acres in open space for a certain amount of units in the development. This could go in a couple of directions. While the intent of this portion of the contract is to provide an open space for the residents the language of the contract is vague and the worry is that the developer could donate acres of land that are less usable, because of topography and location, that meet the letter of the contract while putting the city in a disadvantageous situation. To give the city more options

there would need to be an amendment to the development agreement and staff would need Council's direction and approval for this to happen. This would not only benefit the city but also provide advantageous options and benefits for the developer.

Council Member Hathaway asked if there was enough water dedicated for all of this development and Assistant City Manager Beagley responded that there was. Council Member Miller asked what the city could do this year to address the Harvest View parking and fencing issues since the development adjacent to the complex is taking a phased approach and may not get to building that connector road mentioned. City Manager Reeves said additional road base could be put in with some temporary solutions to at least better outline parking slots for vehicles.

Discussion Regarding City Facilities – Continued

City Manager Reeves presented some budget figures to the Council that included a \$6 million budget with \$5 million dedicated to the construction itself and the remaining \$1 million for interior furnishings, supplies, and other miscellaneous costs.

Reeves explained that as of now it's clear that additional office space is needed for the city but the Council still must determine where that office space will be. Staff is currently working to get dollar figures and facts that will allow the Council to clearly compare the various options for a new city hall.

Reeves suggested that videos from the Council Members be created for their constituencies to explain the need, associated costs, and ultimate decision from the Council. Council Member Bowman agreed that this was a good approach and said that this shows good faith on part of the city as this isn't a decision that requires any vote from the public. The rest of the Council agreed with Council Member Bowman's comments.

Mayor Hunsaker explained that this will be a good idea to help the public understand the need for additional office space and that when compared to city halls in Utah that Santaquin's facility ranks among the lowest of quality.

Council Member Mecham asked what the best case scenario was for staff to be moved into a new building. City Manager Reeves said that this depended on the location of the new office building whether the city renovated a building or opted for a new build. Assistant City Manager Beagley said that a new build would be roughly double the timeframe of a renovation, whatever that timeframe may be, just to give a rough estimate.

NEW BUSINESS & ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS

Ordinance 03-01-2020 "An Ordinance Amending the Electric Utility Franchise and General Utility Easement Agreement with Rocky Mountain Power"

City Manager Reeves explained that when the city takes on a project typically Rocky Mountain Power takes responsibility for moving the power lines. The city is currently in the unique situation where a part of the grocery store project and its electrical infrastructure affects four residential homes.

This amendment allows for Rocky Mountain Power to keep the electrical poles in place instead of grounding the wire which would delay the grocery store progress as the city would have to get easements for the properties which would take time. This amendment to the agreement promises that the city will take on financial obligation of grounding the power lines once the widening of Main Street takes place.

Resolution 03-02-2020 "A Resolution Approving an Infrastructure Deferral Agreement for the Ellsworth Town Homes 2-Lot Subdivision"

City Manager Reeves gave background to the Resolution which would waive the developers rights to protest when the city decides to put in road, side, and gutter improvements and that the developer will participate financial to bare their appropriate financial costs.



Zone: R-10 Size: 0.95 Acres

Lots: 3

The Countryside Estates Plat E subdivision is located at approximately 211 East and 820 South. The proposal is to subdivide 0.95 acres into 3 single family lots. Single Family lots are a permitted use in the R-10 Residential Zone. Each lot is required to be a minimum of 10,000 sq. ft. and have a minimum lot frontage of 80 feet. The proposed subdivision meets these minimum lot requirements.

The Development Review Committee (DRC) reviewed Countryside Estates Plat E on April 23, 2019. At the DRC meeting it was determined that the development didn't meet the access requirement in the code. Only 10 lots were allowed for one access and this subdivision would add more than 10 lots to one access. The applicant applied for a code amendment to change the access requirement. A code amendment was passed by the City Council on September 17, 2019 which changed the requirement from 10 lots on one access to an access not exceeding a maximum of 500 linear feet unless the City Council grants special approval. The Council later granted approval on November 19, 2019 for this access to be no more than 750 feet long. Due to the project being over 500', a turnaround is required. The applicant submitted updated plans with the turnaround and it was reviewed by DRC and the Planning Commission and unanimously recommended that this proposed subdivision be approved.

A 3-lot subdivision review is usually an expedited process with the Planning Commission being the land use authority. However, because there is right-of-way dedication, the City Council is involved in approval of this 3-lot subdivision.

Staff Recommendation: It is recommended that the City Council approve the Countryside Estates Plat E Subdivision and accept the right-of-way dedication with a condition that redlines be addressed.

Recommended Motion: "Motion to approve the Countryside Estates Plat E Subdivision and accept right-of-way dedication with the following condition:

All redlines be addressed.
