He reported he had met with the Representatives of the "Seasons of Santaquin". They are evaluating the possibility of using the basement of the facility for Senior's dinners and activities. He also reported he has had 4 meetings with the LDS Church officials to discuss trading property for the 300 West Chapel. More information will be shared as it is available.

He is continuing working with the EPA with regard to lifting the requirements on sewer lagoon land. Two land appraisals have been received.

On February 21, 2018, the Santaquin City Council passed Resolution 02-08-2018 which surplussed the Old Public Safety Building parcels and authorized the staff to remove the structures on the properties and consolidate those parcels into one parcel.

Chief Stephen Olson has been leading the effort on behalf of the city to obtain the necessary demolition permits. In so doing, a required asbestos inspection identified that all three structures have asbestos present. However, only the front two structures need to have the asbestos abated. He has obtained three bids to have the asbestos removed so that the buildings can be demolished. They are as follows:

Chief Olson and Manager Reeves recommend that we award the bid to Asbestos Abatement of Utah as they are the low cost provider.

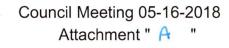

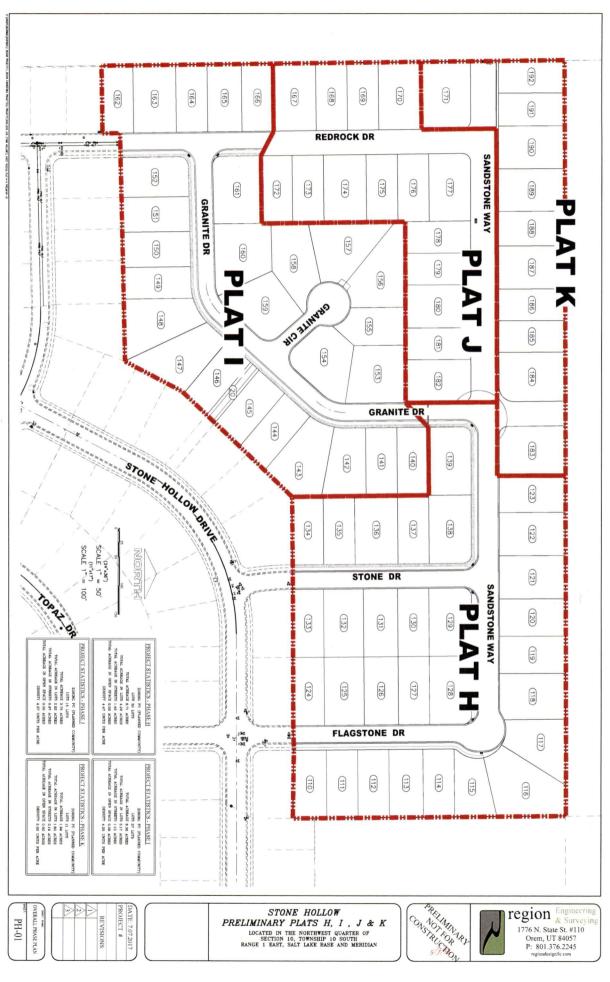
Salisbury Homes is seeking an amended preliminary approval for Stone Hollow Plats J and K. Together, these plats include 26 lots on approximately 5.74 acres. This property is located in the Planned Community (PC) Zone and is a part of the Summit Ridge Development.

The City Council previously granted preliminary approval of plats H, I, J and K at the January 3, 2018 City Council meeting. Final approval was granted by the DRC and construction has started on plats H and I. However, the developer would like to slightly modify the proposed plats J and K before seeking final approval from the DRC. Since this change is different than what the City Council approved, these modifications are being presented to the City Council.

This change only impacts lot 171 as shown on the plans and proposes that this lot be a part of Plat K instead of Plat J. The number and sizes of the lots do not change.

**Staff Recommendation:** It is recommended that the City Council grant preliminary approval of the Stone Hollow Subdivision Plat Phases J and K.

**Recommended motion:** "Motion to approve the preliminary plan for the Stone Hollow Subdivision Plat Phases J and K of the Summit Ridge Development.

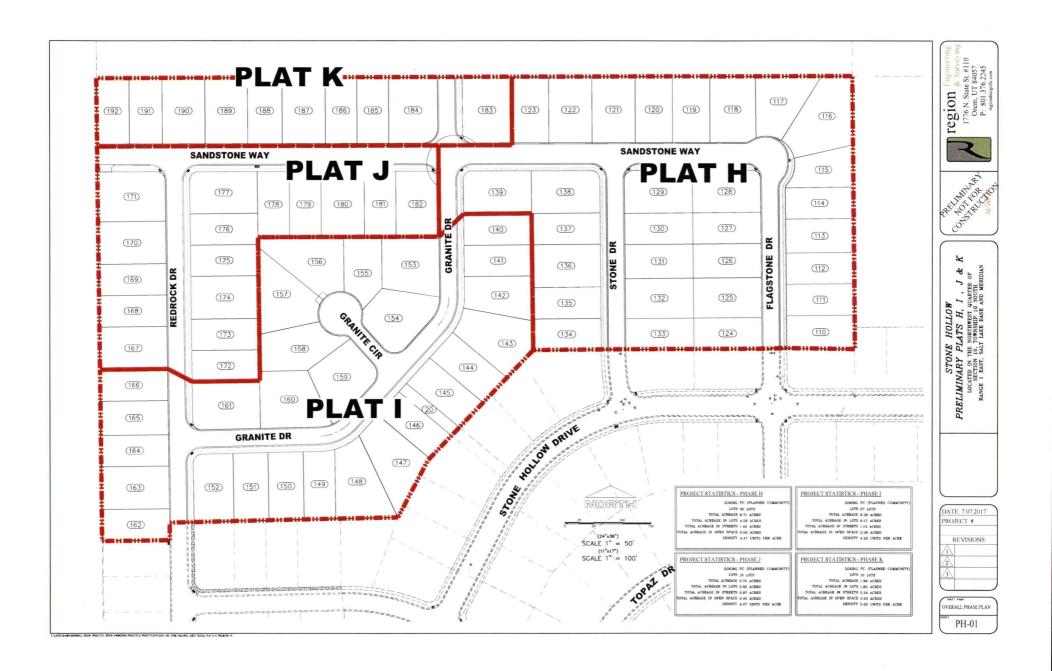


OVERALL PHASE PLAN REVISIONS

Re: JEDCO Recreation Remodel Change Order

Due to delays in delivery of the exterior building panels and severe weather which created unsafe working conditions, the project is currently 8-10 days behind schedule. JEDCO Construction is seeking City Council approval for additional time to complete the project.

**Project Impacts**: The exterior building panels (walls & roof) were ordered the last full week of February. Prior to, and at the time of contract award, the contractor and the City were told by the manufacture of the panels to expect a 3 week lead time for the delivery of the wall panels and a 4 weeks lead time for delivery of the roof panels. Unfortunately, the panels were not delivered to the construction site until March 22<sup>nd</sup>, which constitutes a 1-week delay.

The panel installers were onsite the following day, March 23<sup>rd</sup> to begin installation. However, there was an extreme windstorm that day that did not allow them to start installing panels due to the dangerous conditions which posed a hazard to the safety of the employees of the contractor and sub-contractors as well as potential damage to the panels.

Subsequent to March 23<sup>rd</sup>, there were additional days of weather delays (high winds and/or snow/rain) that further prevented the installation of either wall or roof panels. Those dates are: March 24, 2018 (high winds and a small amount of snow); March 28, 2018 (high winds); April 2, 2018 (high winds); April 7, 2018 (rain); April 9, 2018 (high winds); April 12, 2018 (small amount of rain & high winds); April 13, 2018 (small amount of rain & high winds); April 16, 2018 (high winds); April 17, 2018 (high winds); April 23, 2018 (high winds); April 30, 2018 (small amount of rain & high winds); May 1, 2018 (moderate rain); May 3, 2018 (moderate rain).

To be clear, not all of the days listed above were a complete loss. When weather conditions allowed for continued construction, the contractor made productive use of that time. As such, it is estimated that one full week was lost overall due to the weather delays. Furthermore, the contractor and/or subcontractors on the project have worked Saturdays for the last several weeks trying to complete the work as soon as possible.

Because of the panel delivery delay and the lost days due to weather and unsafe working conditions, other trades and project work has also been pushed back/delayed.

The contractor is seeking an additional 10-days for substantial completion and an additional 8-days for final completion.

Currently the contracted substantial completion date is May 15, 2018. A 10-day change would extend the substantial completion date to May 25, 2018. Currently the final completion date is May 31, 2018. An 8-day extension would extend the final completion date to June 8, 2018.

City staff concurs with the contractor's assessment of weather conditions and related working conditions. City staff has verified the manufacturing and delivery delays of the wall and roof panels. Furthermore, city staff has observed the contractors efforts to work on Saturdays and where possible on bad weather days to lessen the impacts to the overall project schedule. Lastly, the contractor's request will have no financial impact on the project. For these reasons, city staff recommends approval of the contractor's request.

**Recommended Motion:** Motion to approve a change in dates for substantial completion and final completion for the JEDCO contract for the recreation remodel project.
