HELD AT THE CONSTRUCTION SITE OF A NEW PUBLIC WORKS BUILDING
APPROXIMATELY 1215 NORTH CENTER
AUGUST 19, 2015**

He gave a brief history highlighting the history of the public works department, which has grown from 3 employees to 12, as the City's population has increased from 1,236 to over 10,000. He said the building was being constructed with no tax increase, as the City had waited until the public safety building was fully paid for.
