**MINUTES OF A COUNCIL WORK SESSION
HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS
MARCH 07, 2012**

The meeting was called to order by Mayor James E. DeGraffenried at 6:05 pm. Council Members attending: Matthew Carr, James Linford, and Rick Steele. Keith Broadhead was excused due to illness. Richard Payne was excused due to a family vacation.

Others attending: City Manager Ben Reeves, Community Development Director Dennis Marker, Staff Planner Greg Flint, Brent Norton, Spencer Healey, and other unidentified individuals.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

General Plan Update 2012 (Survey Results)

Staff Planner Flint reviewed the information gathered in a General Plan Survey November and December 2011. Attached is a copy of the information reviewed.

Development Progress

Director Marker updated the Mayor and Council Members on a number of issues. He presented a listing of owners of property in the 400 East Main Street area. Sorenson Brothers Orchards, LLC has the most property value; with the properties owned by the City and Mechams having the most desirable access. (See attachment "B").

As a CDA project area is created near 400 East, the assessed value of properties will factor into how much tax-increment monies are available to help development take off.

Legal Counsel Rich is drafting a development agreement which allows individual property owners to act as a whole. It is advised that in the case of multiple property owners, the agreement allow them to contract with a project manager to promote the properties as a group. Each property owner would pay costs proportionate to their land percentage.

Next Tuesday at 11 a.m. a webinar will be held discussing procedures allowing businesses posting information to access the City's website. The webinar will be held at the Public Safety Building.

Bids have been received for all the site furnishings for the North Park. When the bids are reviewed the final numbers will be presented to the Council. A Neighborhood Meeting will be held next Wednesday at 7:00 pm in the Seniors Center for the residents within a ½ mile radius of the North Park. The meeting will provide development information pertaining to the park development plans.

Director Marker as well as Leisure Services Director Kevin Schmidt met with a vendor of prefab restrooms. The vendor indicated the buildings were "vandal proof" with the building being built primarily out of concrete. The difference in cost of the "prefab" building and a "stick" building is approximately \$10,000 per building. All lighting would be motion sensitive which allows for "drive by" checks to see if anyone is in the building when the buildings should be locked and out of service. It was the consensus of the Council to research the use and actual cost of the prefab restrooms. The square footage of the \$35,000 building is approximately 10' x 21'. He also reported a "City wide" security system would be

approximately \$25,000 to install. The Council Members were in favor of adding additional lighting instead of the security system. The Public Works Director has requested adding an ADA access into the Eastside Park with the projects. The Council Members were in agreement of the addition also. (See attachment "C" for prefab information).

City Council Meeting Agenda Items

Agenda Item 12.d. Ordinance 03-01-2012 will need to be moved to just after item 11.b.

City Manager Reeves reported the "Notice of Award" for the Wastewater Reclamation Facility Project was approved by the City Council more than a year ago when the bids were originally opened. It was awarded to Flatiron Construction, as the low bidder. He said "It was also contingent on us closing on the bonds as well as contingent...we didn't recognize this but it was on or about January 18, 2011, and that word on or about causes a little bit of concern. It could be argued the word 'about' means that we are still in that time frame because of the delays that we have had, we are still within that. To be extremely conservative and make sure that the Notice of Award is 100% accurate Brett recommended that we bring that back before the Council and have you amend the Notice of Award to be able to make sure that is solidified with Flatiron and we can proceed and move forward".

"With the Notice of Award there are typically two things that immediately follow thereafter. There is 1, signing of the contracts, and the previous Notice of Award did approve the Mayor to go forward and sign the contracts with Flatiron, and then a Notice to Proceed. After receiving the Notice of Award the Contractor typically has 15 days to obtain their Payment and Performance Bonds. We then typically have 15 days to review the bonds. If the time frame is shorter, a Notice to Proceed can be issued".

Mr. Reeves said one of desires of the Council is to have the current lagoons retired as part of the same project. Through value engineering, after the contract is signed, we can start "negotiating with the contractor to work that in and make it happen". "We cannot enter into any value engineering process whatsoever until contracts are signed because it would be inappropriate and unfair to the other bidders that you would negotiate with one and not all". The steps required are to offer the Notice of Award, sign the contracts, begin the value engineering and then offer the Notice to Proceed.

Council Member Steele was told Flatiron Construction has agreed to "hold with the original bid" of the project. There will be a change order presented after all documents are signed addressing the time frame of the project. The original contracts were drafted a year ago and anticipated an 18 month time schedule. After the Notice to Proceed is presented there will be a change order reflecting the new project date which is 18 months from when they actually begin. After the contracts are signed, and if changes are made to the project, either eliminating or adding items, there will be additional change orders presented to the Council for consideration. There have been two cost increases that we are experiencing on the project, approximately \$200,000 in closing costs, which were additional costs for Legal and Bond Attorneys. General Electric costs have increased based on the membranes that we ordered and every delay has added costs each month. "What we are requesting from a

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Staff perspective on 11a is that the Council would amend the Notice to Proceed, to change the date or even remove the date, that specific January 18, 2011 date, also acknowledgement to the Council through that motion that this is authorizing the Mayor to close on the contracts and be able to issue the Notice to Proceed at the appropriate time".

In a telephone conversation with City Manager Reeves, Council Member Broadhead indicated he had a question with regard to thresholds pertaining to Change Orders. The threshold used for the Main Street Project allowed Staff to approved Change Orders if they did not increase the time or the budget beyond the contingency amount. Council Member Steele said he was fine with using the same system as the Main Street Project but would like to review any engineering issues. Council Member Linford was in agreement.

General Discussion

Time was not available for a general discussion.

At 6:50 pm the meeting adjourned.





At night, headlights are insufficient for lighting that area and it makes it difficult to drive through. People in our area also believe a stop sign is needed at the corners of 180 North and Orchard Lane, and 700 East and Orchard Lane. Too many kids in this area, and too many drivers who don't bother to slow down pulling out on to Orchard because there's no sign-yield or stop or otherwise. Those are both school bus stop areas as well. It's very dangerous and numerous 'close calls' have already taken place. These are my suggestions.




How often does family use city parks


Recreational facilities

Amount of Recreation Facilities








Alternative Modes of Transportation












How would you define “open space”? (select all that apply)








