

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**MINUTES OF A COUNCIL WORK SESSION
HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS
MAY 11, 2011**

The meeting was called to order by Mayor James E. DeGraffenried at 6:00 pm. Council Members attending: Filip Askerlund, James Linford, and Brent Vincent.

Others attending: City Manager Ben Reeves, Community Development Director Dennis Marker, and Legal Counsel Rich.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Review of the Council Agenda

Council Member Vincent was told the \$20,000 paid to Antonio Guerra was compensation through the Main Street Project for the loss of the use of his garage.

Mr. Marker reported there is a party interested in purchasing a parcel of property on the West end of the landfill. Council Members Vincent, Askerlund, and Linford were in favor of pursuing the sell of the property.

Mr. Marker reported the Main Street Project is progressing. There is one property owner who has not consented to the project and has threatened a lawsuit. It was reported the Little Brown Sugar Baker is experience an impact to their business. Council Member Vincent reported all the business are experiencing the same impact and believed all the property owners were aware of the impact on their business and have signed off on the project.

Mayor DeGraffenried reported Legal Counsel Rich received a petition from Genola Residents voicing their concern with potential flooding. He reported Summit Creek Irrigation in conjunction with Utah County are diligently working to mitigate any flood issues (see attachment "A" for the petition).

General Discussion

City Manager Reeves reported there are two ribbon cutting ceremonies scheduled for this month. The first one will be held at Competitive Automotive on Saturday, May 14th at 2pm and the second scheduled for Tuesday, May 18th at 3pm for the Mexi Grill. He also reported that the Chamber annual B-B-Q beginning at 6:30pm with the Mayor and Council Members being invited.

City Manager Reeves reviewed the proposed ballot language for voting on the Sewer Treatment Facility. He questioned if the Council Members would like to combine the Bonding Ordinances in order to simplify the voting process. The statement was made that by making the change there would be additional confusion within the public. Council Members Askerlund, Linford and Vincent indicted they would like to the language to stay the same.

The meeting adjourned at 6:55 pm.

PETITION

We a few of the citizens of Genola are filing this petition in regards to the possible flooding of our property. The flood water will come from Santaquin canyon. This water belongs to the Summit Creek Irrigation Company NOT Genola, therefore it is their responsibility to make sure this water is maintained and handled by avoiding and preventing misuse of water that could flood our properties.

It has been proven in a court of law that this is not the natural flow for the run off water from Santaquin canyon.

The point of diversion flows into a man made reservoir that does not have an outlet except too overflow and come into Genola or into a pipeline that holds minimal amount of water for their irrigation system. Summit Creek Irrigation Co. water appropriation has to be put to beneficial use and there by cannot be negligent in high water management.

The citizens of Genola are prepared to file a law suit for the loss to property, landscape, crops, income and any cost involved in any way in preparing or cleaning the damage to properties or individuals including attorney fees.
