Others attending: Planning Commission Member Matt Carr, Director of Public Safety Dennis Howard and Chief Cody Cullimore.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Safety in Public Meeting

Police Chief Cody Cullimore, Lindon City

Director Dennis Howard introduced Cody Cullimore as the Chief of Lindon City and guess speaker for the night.

Chief Cullimore began the training by showing a You-Tube clip "School Board Shooting Heroes" Chief Cullimore indicted the guy in the video was upset because his wife was laid off by the school board. He came into the meeting with the intent of dying that day. Chief Cullimore reviewed some of the ways the City Council could prepare for an act of violence during a public meeting.

Chief Cullimore suggested installing panic buttons, security cameras or having Cell phones or a landline close at hand. He indicated the Mayor and Council were at a disadvantage because of the layout of the room. There is only one way in and one way out. A discussion ensued about how to keep the employees safe as well. After the discussion, Director Howard indicted he would contact an alarm specialist for a bid to install panic buttons in the Council Chambers and the Front Office.

The work session ended at 7:45 pm.
