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

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**MINUTES OF A WORK SESSION  
HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS  
OCTOBER 13, 2010**

Mayor DeGraffenried called the meeting to order at approximately 6:05 pm. Council Members attending: Filip Askerlund, Martin Green, James Linford, Rick Steele, and Brent Vincent.

**DISCUSSION ITEMS**

***400 E/Main Street Project***

Mayor DeGraffenried led an open discussion with regard to the proposed 400 E/Main Street Project. There were many comments in favor of and against the project.

***General Discussion***

Council Member Steele asked if he could "rent a cherry picker" and pull out some of the stop signs within the City. City Manager Reeves indicated he would take "full responsibility" for the grief placing the stop signs has caused the Mayor and Council Members. He reported there were errors in the "placement map" as well as errors with the Public Works Department placing the signs. He indicated the Public Works Director will review signage with the Director of Public Safety and the Community Development Director.

It was reported that the Town of Genola has been reviewing the possibility of having the Utah County Sheriffs Department patrol the town boundaries and terminating the current contract with Santaquin City. It was reported that the Police budget would be decreased by the amount charged to Genola for service. More information will be given as it is available.

City Manager Reeves reported he had a number of issues to report on (see attachment "A" for the "To Do" list).

Council Member Steele was told there 2 applicants for the assistance program. Only 1 is eligible for assistance under the current guidelines.

Council Member Askerlund was told that the interest rate on the new police vehicle financing will be established at the time the vehicle is delivered.

Council Member Askerlund was told the ATV Ordinance has been passed. He will obtain a copy of the Ordinance.

Council Member Green reported he would be out of town on December 1<sup>st</sup> and possibly on the 8<sup>th</sup>. It was determined there would not be a work session on December 22<sup>nd</sup> and December 29<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor DeGraffenried is currently working with Warren Ahlin on Pole Canyon water issues. More information will be shared as it is available.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 pm.
