#### **NEW BUSINESS**

County Commissioner Gary Anderson – introduction and update

Commissioner Anderson introduced himself. He indicated he had received a number of negative reports with regard to the accessibility of Commission Members. He indicated he planned to change that perception of the Commission. He offered contact information to the Mayor and Council Members, which included his home phone number.

Council Member Askerlund requested an update on the "Sumsion" Gravel Pit. It was reported that the County has required a Reclamation Plan be submitted to the County. Commissioner Anderson reported the owners were also submitting an application to operate a crusher within gravel pit.

The Mayor and Council Members thanked Commissioner Anderson for his willingness to acknowledge Santaquin as part of the County and for his willingness to work with the City as needed.

Council Member Roberts thanked the Commissioner for coming to the Council Meeting.

Discussion and possible action regarding a request to adjust lot lines at approximately 400 North 300 East

Mayor DeGraffenried indicated the owner of this property is his son Jimmy. He also indicated he didn't have an "interest" in any project associated with this property.

City Planner Marker indicated Jimmy DeGraffenried is seeking approval of a lot line adjustment request at approximately 400 North 300 East. The proposed adjustment would modify the boundary of three lots owned by the applicant. Santaquin City Code, 11-5-11.F, requires lot line adjustment to be approved by the City's Land Use Authority prior to recordation at the County (see attachment "A" for Staff Recommendations).

Council Member Green moved to approve the Lot Line adjustment as outlined in the Staff Report. Council Member Roberts seconded the motion. Council Member Linford was told the frontage requested makes the lot non-conforming but does meet the requirements of the City Ordinances. After the discussion, Council Members Linford, Roberts, Adcock, Green and Askerlund voted in the affirmative.

Discussion and possible action with regard to the Summit Ridge Sewer and Water Impact Fee Reimbursement

City Planner Marker reported the City Engineer David Thurgood has reviewed the Summit Ridge Sewer and Water Impact Fee Reimbursement issue (see attachment "B" for Mr. Thurgood's Memorandum).

Council Member Adcock moved to approve the Summit Ridge Sewer and Water Impact Fee Reimbursement as outlined in the Annexation and Development Agreement. Council Member Green seconded the motion. Council Members Linford, Roberts, Adcock, Green and Askerlund

voted in the affirmative. City Recorder Farnsworth was asked to draft the reimbursement check on Monday.

Discussion on Citywide clean up

Citywide cleanup will be scheduled for June 9<sup>th</sup> through June 16<sup>th</sup>. Council Member Askerlund will contact the Religious Leaders asking for help through the congregations. The City Landfill will be open on Saturdays only without the requirement of a landfill card. All of the landfill regulations will apply to all dumping.

Council Member Askerlund reported the Santaquin Utah Stake (South part of the City) has scheduled a "Super Activity" which would include cleaning Main Street. He requested an Officer be available to help with cautioning the drivers of workers on the Main Street. Chief Howard said if the activity is held within this budget year, he would have money in the overtime budget to pay an Officer to be present. He indicated the overtime budget for next year is very limited. Council Member Green volunteered to sit in a Police Car and run the caution lights so the Police budget would not be impacted.

Discussion and possible action with regard to SUVMWA issues

Council Member Adcock presented the budget for the South Utah Valley Municipal Water Association. Santaquin's percentage of the total budget would be 6.62%, which equates to \$3,350.19. Council Member Adcock reported CUP water should be available from Spanish Fork Canyon within the next 5 years. Council Member Adcock indicated in order to complete this agenda item, an Executive Session would be required.

#### **BUSINESS LICENSES**

Council Member Adcock reported the following Business License Applications have been reviewed and has been found to meet all the City requirements:

Notice: This item was not required to be noticed to adjacent property owners.

#### **Background:**

Mr. Jimmy DeGraffenried is seeking approval of a lot line adjustment request at approximately 400 North 300 East (See attached map). The proposed adjustment would modify the boundary of three lots owned by the applicant (See attached Plat Map). Santaquin City Code, 11-5-11.F, requires lot line adjustments to be approved by the City's Land Use Authority prior to recordation at the County.

#### **Analysis:**

#### Ordinance Review.

SCC 11-5-11.F lists the following requirements to be met in order to adjust boundary lines between lots:

1. No new dwelling lot or housing unit results from the lot line adjustment;

There are three existing parcels which could be built on. The proposal makes the smallest of the three lots more buildable.

2. The adjoining property owners consent to the lot line adjustment;

The applicant owns all three parcels being affected. No other consenting parties are necessary.

The lot line adjustment does not result in remnant land that did not 3. previously exist;

The proposal enlarges the smallest lot, which would have likely remained in an undeveloped state and appeared as a remnant parcel.

4. The adjustment does not result in violation of applicable zoning requirements;

The R-8 zone requires at least 80 feet of frontage for interior lots and 95 feet for corner lots. The lot frontages are shown in the following table

Lot	Required Frontage	Current Frontage	Proposed Frontage
1 (Corner Lot	95' on both streets	83' x 114'	95' x 95'
2 (Interior Lot)	80'	93'	80.83
3 (Interior Lot)	80	50	70'

The R-8 zone requires at least 8,000 square feet for interior lots and 9,025 square feet for corner lots. The lot areas are shown in the following table

Lot	Required Area	Current Area	Proposed Area
1 (Corner Lot	9,025 sq. ft.	9,462 sq. ft.	9,025 sq. ft.
2 (Interior Lot)	8,000 sq. ft.	15,345 sq. ft.	12,964 sq. ft.
3 (Interior Lot)	8,000 sq. ft.	4,100 sq. ft.	6,650 sq. ft.

The proposal makes the corner lot and lot 3 more conforming to required frontages. The proposal also brings lot 3 into more compliance with the required lot area.

5. The proposed adjustment does not move outside of any approved public utility easements, or an agreement with any and all affected utility agencies or entities is formed to maintain or realign the easement; and

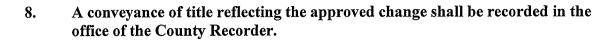
Public Utility easements are being realigned with this proposal. The applicant will need to provide letters from affected utility companies as to the adequacy of the new easement locations.

6. The petition has been reviewed and approved by the director of Community Development prior to recordation with the county recorder's office, as applicable.

This can be done after City Engineering staff has had opportunity to review the proposal and verify accuracy of the surveys and easement locations.

When the proposal is taken to the County for recordation the following information is required

- 7. Notice of approval shall be recorded in the office of the county recorder which:
  - a. is executed by each owner included in the exchange and by the land use authority;
  - b. contains an acknowledgment for each party executing the notice in accordance with the provisions of State Code Title 57, Chapter 2a, Recognition of Acknowledgments Act; and
  - c. recites the descriptions of both the original parcels and the parcels created by the exchange of title; and



#### Recommendation:

Staff recommends the City Council approve the proposed lot line adjustments located at approximately 400 North 300 East, based on the following findings and subject to the following condition:

#### **Findings**

- 1. The affected parcels are all owned by the same individual.
- 2. The proposal can meet all of the requirements established by S.C.C. 11-5-11 for a lot line adjustment.
- 3. The proposal will eliminate a possible nuisance parcel.
- 4. The three proposed lots will be made more conforming to the City zoning requirements established in S.C.C. 10-7.

#### **Condition**

That City engineering staff verify all legal descriptions and recording information prior to recordation of the proposal.

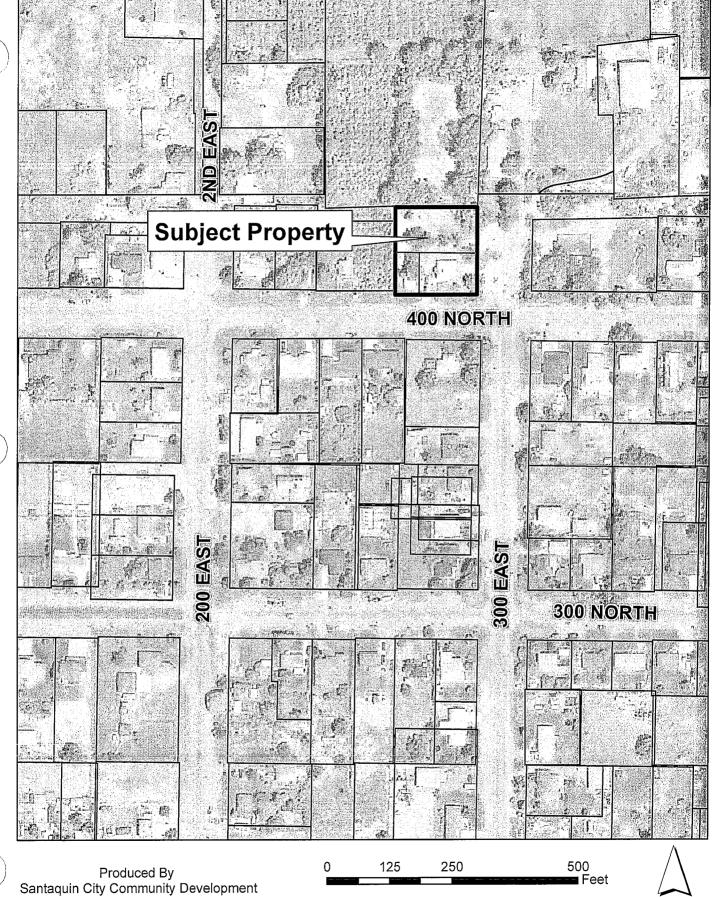

### Proposed Lot Line Adjustments 400 North 300 East

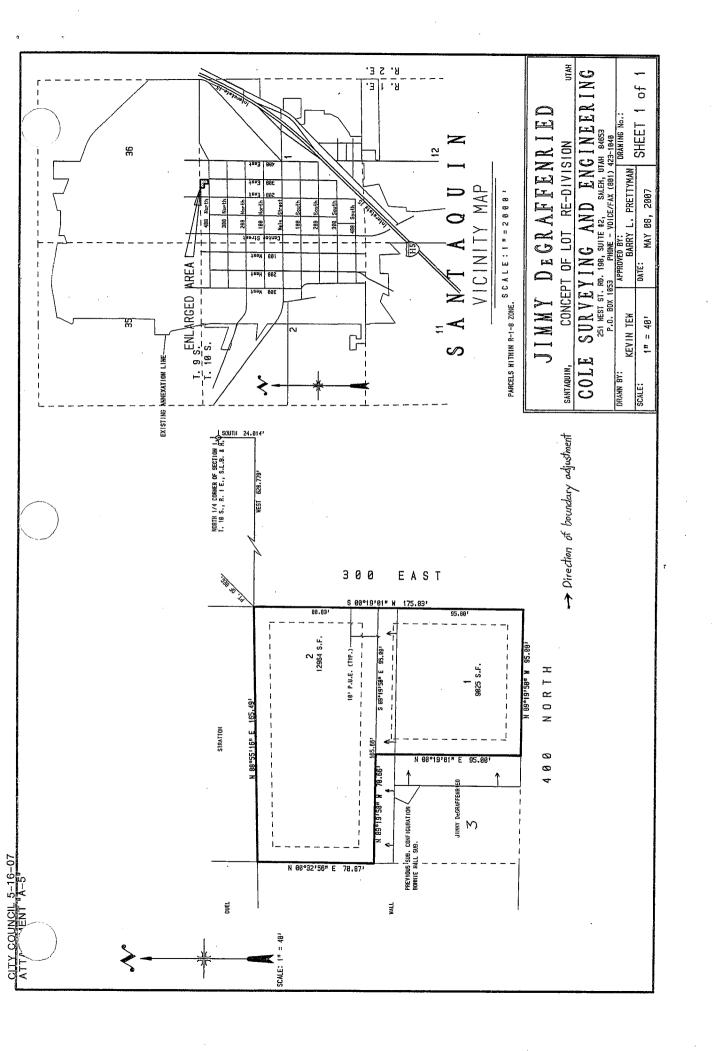
