

- 1: Minutes of a regular Santaquin City Council meeting held on Tuesday, December 4, 1984, at City Hall. Mayor Sandra Peterson presided at the meeting and the following Councilmen were present: Art Adcock, Dan Olson, Clara Goudy, Grant Pay and Marilyn Clayson, who entered the meeting at 7:30 p.m. City Recorder/Clerk Sam Sellers recorded the meeting.
- 2: Mayor Peterson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Councilman Adcock offered the invocation and led the pledge of allegiance.
- 3: Prior minutes. The Council reviewed the minutes of November 20, 1984. Councilman Adcock moved that the minutes be accepted and Councilman Goudy seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- 4: Susan Madsen - Santaquin Canyon. Mrs. Madsen stated that she and the other people present are concerned with the canyon.
- 5: Mayor Peterson said that there are a lot of things the city is being told which she doesn't understand. She said that she cannot understand why an Environmental Impact Study has to be performed on a road which was already in existence. She said that this is in the process of being completed.
- 6: Councilman Olson said that the city has asked that the road be replaced as it was before the '83 flooding. He also said that the community's involvement in telephoning, etc., really impressed them on their decision. He also explained that the geological surface of the canyon has been changed because of the flood waters.
- : Councilman Olson also said that he discussed the streambank stabilization problem with the Forest Service and they call this a grey area and do not feel they will be pouring money into a project in Santaquin Canyon.
- 8: City property below the mouth of the Canyon near Rodna Campbell's home. Mrs. Campbell was present with her son and daughter-in-law. Mrs. Campbell's son explained that if this property were put up for sale that they would like to have the first option on it and that they were not too excited about having an irrigation pond on this site.
- 9: Councilman Olson stated that the Rowley's would like to purchase this site for a sprinkling irrigation pond.
- 10: Councilman Goudy asked about the proposed use of this site for a secondary irrigation system for the city. Councilman Olson stated that Summitt Creek Irrigation Co. has approved the city's use of their pipeline system for the city's secondary irrigation system.
- 11: Councilman Clayson asked if this would be a site for the city's watershed, or the water department headquarters. Councilman Olson said that most of their work is involved in town and this would be too far to go.
- 12: Councilman Olson said that he would honor the Campbell's request for the first option if the property comes up for sale.
- : Mr. Sellers said that he remembered this site as the possible plant for power generation. Councilman Olson said that this might very well be.
- 14: Jake Kester said that this property was purchased while he was in office. He

said that this property was purchased in conjunction with the new headhouse and that it was intended for a park in the area. He stated that this could not be used for a headhouse, as it is too low.

- 15: Jim Stanton - energy saving devices. The Council reviewed Mr. Stanton's proposals for energy saving devices on the furnaces in the city. The Council asked Mr. Stanton to install the units at the city shop and city hall.
- 16: COUNCIL BUSINESS:
- 17: 1. Flood Committee dinner - Councilman Olson stated that Jake Kester has resigned as the Chairman of the Flood Committee. He said that the Committee would like to have a dinner in his honor and would also like to invite Mr. Sellers and his wife. He would like the city to pay for three of the dinners. Councilman Olson moved that this would be approved and Councilman Goudy seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- 18: 2. Waste bill for November - The Council considered this bill of \$3006.50. Councilman Adcock moved that this be paid and Councilman Clayson seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- 19: 3. Business licenses - The only business license for the Council's consideration was Jim Eva's. He requested a license for an iron working business at his home. Councilman Goudy moved that this license be issued and Councilman Adcock seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- 20: Public Hearing on an Ammendment to Zone Ordinance. The Council reviewed the ordinance. There were no public comments either for nor against the ordinance. Councilman Adcock moved that Ordinance #84-6, entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMMENDING ORDINANCE NO 84-2, SECTION 20, PART 4; AND SECTION 21, PART 4, OF SANTAQUIN CITY, UTAH COUNTY, UTAH.", be approved and Councilman Pay seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- 21: 4. Chief Knox - rifles - Chief Knox indicated that he has heard there has been some discussion in the past concerning the assault rifles the city purchased in the past. He said that they were purchased for the purpose of barricaded suspects and the danger this proposed to the officers by individuals with high powered rifles. Officer Schmidt explained that the instructors in the Utah POST Academy also urged the officers there to ask for high powered rifles for their own protection. He also said that other departments are realizing the dangers of sending officers armed with side arms and shotguns against criminals with rifles.
- 22: Chief Knox explained that he felt the city should retain the rifles, rather than send the officers into situations without the proper equipment to handle them. The Council felt the reasons were sufficient to retain the rifles.
- 23: Mayor Peterson asked Chief Knox about some shirts which were purchased from Eagle Co. Chief Knox said that these two shirts were for Mark Pulham and Brett Lindsay, two new police reserves. He indicated that the city has three reservists at this time with Bill Butler being the third reservist.
- : Open hearing for an ordinance on private materials on public property. The Council reviewed this ordinance. There was no public input either for nor against this ordinance. Councilman Adcock moved that the city accept Ordinance #84-7, entitled, "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PRIVATE OWNED MATERIALS UPON THE CITY

STREETS OF SANTAQUIN CITY, UTAH COUNTY, UTAH." Councilman Goudy seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

- 25: Open hearing on an ordinance covering financial administration. The Council reviewed this ordinance covering the orderly payment of the city's bills. There was no public input either for nor against the ordinance. Councilman Olson moved that Ordinance # 84-8, entitled "FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION ORDINANCE." be accepted by the city and Councilman Pay seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- 26: Open hearing on the updated business license ordinance. As there were no public present who desired to comment and the Council had previously performed extensive work on this ordinance, Councilman Goudy moved that Ordinance #84-9, entitled "AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A BUSINESS LICENSE REQUIREMENT UPON ALL BUSINESSES, TRADES AND PROFESSIONS IN SANTAQUIN CITY AND ESTABLISHING FEES THEREFOR, FOR REGULATION AND REVENUES." be accepted by the city. Councilman Pay seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
- 27: Resolution of fees for the Business License Ordinance. Councilman Goudy moved that Resolution #84-13 be accepted and Councilman Olson seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- 28: 5. Christmas Party - The Christmas party for the City Council and employees was set for 6:30 p.m. on the 21st day of December, 1984. Councilmen Goudy and Clayson are to be over the party. Mr. Sellers was instructed to order the candy for children's party at the school and to make arrangements for the school.
- 29: Councilman Olson moved that the city purchase turkeys or hams for the city employees. Councilman Adcock seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
- 30: Councilman Adcock. Councilman Adcock reviewed with the Council a contract with Leland Kelley concerning picking up the garbage in town. He asked Mr. Sellers to type this up.
- 31: Councilman Pay. Councilman Pay stated that it was the Council's intent, but they did not clarify this, that Wade Eva's and Jeff Peterson's raises were to have been retroactive to the 1st of November, 1984. Councilman Pay moved that this be done and Councilman Olson seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- 32: Councilman Clayson. Councilman Clayson stated that she has been called again about the blacktop in front of Doyle Crook's house. Councilman Pay stated that this would be placed back in in the spring.
- 33: Councilman Olson. Councilman Olson said that there was an old air compressor in the basement of the old school which has been taken to the shop to be used.
- 34: Councilman Olson also stated that a person in Pleasant Grove called him about a track loader which he has for sale. He said that it was built in the late '60's and he wants \$8,000.
- 35: 6. Terry Gardner - apparent drug problem - Councilman Olson explained that he has been under the impression that the city really doesn't have a great drug problem. He said that he has since discussed this with some of the kids in town and found out that there really is a drug problem in Santaquin. Councilman Olson said that Mr. Gardner is also concerned and asked if he could

discuss this with the Council.

- Chief Knox indicated that he has approached the Council about some money to assist in funding the South County Narcotics Task Force and was asked to try and raise the funds. He said that the Police Department put on a dance at the new school and they made a total of \$30.00. He also stated that the Task Force has served warrants in Santaquin.
- 37: Chief Knox said that people might talk to Councilman Olson, but getting them to talk to him is another story.
- 38: Mr. Gardner stated that the things which really bothers him is that there are people using drugs in the Elementary School in Santaquin. He said that the number one hangout for the people using drugs in Santaquin is the Squashhead Park across the road from City Hall. He explained that he has heard that the drugs users feel they have a free ride in Santaquin. Chief Knox said that he would be the first to admitt this fact, and could be an advantage to the Police if they can get someone in to infiltrate.
- 39: Councilman Olson said that the drug users are not afraid of the Police in town and that he feels the Police need to put their own muscle into the situation before it gets too far. He said that he needs to appologize for his attitude and that the Council needs to rethink its priorities and try to get some money available to combat this. He stated that he has been told that drug users have a free rein in town.
- 40: Chief Knox said that the State Narcotics people are more involved in the larger metropolitan areas and cannot staff our problems as well.
- 41: Chief Knox said that he has a meeting the next day with the Task Force. The Council asked Chief Knox to find out how much the city would need to put into the Task Force in order to get substantial results from the Task Force when he meets with them and then to report this back.
- 42: Chief Knox said that the Task Force has already made 4 felony arrests in Santaquin during the last month.
- 43: Councilman Olson. Councilman Olson explained that Officer Kelly applied to the Fire Department but was rejected. He said that the reasons for this are that he is a Police Officer and should be at the fire when he is on duty anyway. He also asked that the Police stay at the fire until it is over in order to maintain traffic control and keep people from driving over hoses.
- 44: Councilman Olson said that he has talked with the Forest Service about some streambank stabalization, but they are not going to do anything. He said that the city is going to have to do something or lose some springs.
- 45: Mr. Sellers. Mr. Sellers explained that the State Engineer's Office wants the city to proof up on Spring #1, which was developed within the last few years. Councilman Olson told him to have Don Cole do this.
- 46: Chief Knox. Chief Knox explained that Officer Kelly's average in POST is 92 with the POST average being 87.
- 47: Bruce Armstrong - PRUD use. Councilman Olson moved that the Council not allow this use of the property and Councilman Adcock seconded. The motion

passed unanimously.

48: Councilman Olson moved that the meeting be adjourned and Councilman Adcock seconded. The motion passed unanimously at 9:40 p.m.
