

Santquin Zoning and Planning Commission  
Minutes of the meeting of March 8, 1978.

The meeting was opened at 7:45PM by Vice-Chairman Lynn Crook. Present were members Dee Davis, Helen Kester, Fred Tasker, ~~and~~ councilman Reed Jensen, and Raleigh Crosby. Robert Hales arrived at 8:30 PM.

The minutes of the meeting of Feb. 28, 1978 were read and accepted as read.

A discussion was held on the proposed new industry that has inquired about locating in Santquin. The <sup>proposed</sup> road, 5<sup>th</sup> West would have to be put in almost immediately should the new industry come in and Mr. Phil Rowley was present to say that he opposed having the road cross his property as he had just installed a new sprinkler system where the new road is supposed to go.

It was suggested that the city might be willing to annex the Rowley property into the city (only that portion between the proposed road and present city limits) in exchange for a right-of-way. This decision, however, would be up to the city council.

A motion was made by Lynn Crook and - - -  
seconded by Dee Davis to extend the  
commerical district from 2nd West, west to  
the present city limits. It would be  $\frac{1}{2}$  block  
deep on each side as in the rest of the  
commerical district. The motion was  
passed unanimously.

The sewer survey was then discussed.  
Faleigh said it would probably have to  
be sent to the state to see what they  
would recommend be done to update it.

The city would then have to hire an  
engineer who would update it.

The survey recommends a lagoon system.  
The commission suggested that the present  
impact fee be put toward the new system.

A motion was made by Lynn Crook and  
seconded by Robert Hales to recommend to  
the city council that they vote now to  
buy land for a lagoon. It could be  
bought on contract over a long period  
of time. The motion was passed unanimously.

It was recommended that the city  
organize the merchants and other

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interested business man into a chamber of Commerce. This group could then decide what type of theme it wanted to have for the future development of Main Street.

The city jail was then discussed. The present jail, located under the old section of the city Hall, is totally inadequate as a prisoner cannot be held there for more ~~than~~ <sup>that</sup> 3 hours because there are no restroom facilities. No decision was reached.

The agenda for the Mar. 22nd meeting will include a representative from the fire Dept. who could not be here this evening, a plan for multiplex development for the master plan and future annexation and growth policies.

Meetings were also set for Thurs. Apr. 6, at 7:30 PM, and Wed. Apr. 19, at 7PM, a public hearing for the Master Plan.

The meeting was adjourned at 10 P.M.
