



OHV Use

Off highway vehicle use is authorized on public streets excluding all state and federal highways under the following standards.

Operation of off-highway vehicles on public streets may only be performed by persons who have a valid motor vehicle operator's license.

Off highway vehicles can be used on public streets except for all state and federal highways and as long as city ordinance is observed. Non street legal ATVs cannot be driven more than 15 miles per hour on streets. Street legal ATVs can be used within posted speed limits. ATVs should be driven on the outside edge of the asphalt whenever possible to not impede regular traffic. Please see city ordinance to read complete and full information: bit.ly/4232PTO



Mayor's Newsletter | July 2025



Summer is a beautiful time of year in Santaquin. I'm excited to share that Santaquin Canyon is now open for use! This long-awaited opening would not have been possible without the support of our Federal Senators and Representatives. I sincerely thank them for helping secure the funding for the road repairs that made this possible.

As always, summer brings vibrant activity to our community—most notably Orchard Days. Orchard Days this year takes place at the end of July and into

the first weekend of August. This tradition holds a special place in many of our hearts. With family-friendly events, rodeos, exhibitor booths, and the beloved parade, Orchard Days brings us together to celebrate Santaquin's heritage. I hope to see many of you there!

Upcoming City Council Meeting: Public Hearing on Property Tax Proposal Following Orchard Days, I want to draw your attention to an important City Council meeting on Thursday, August 7 at 7 p.m. at Santaquin City Hall (110 South Center Street, City Council Chambers). This meeting will include a public hearing on a proposed property tax increase—a topic I addressed in the June 2025 newsletter.

I, along with City Council members and staff, will be present to answer your questions. We strongly encourage your attendance and for you to provide your input.

What are the reasons and the costs

As a fiscal conservative, I don't take any tax proposal lightly. Over the past three and a half years, we've worked hard to strengthen Santaquin's fiscal foundation. We've focused on bringing new businesses to town, helping diversify revenue and limit the need for higher property taxes.

Thanks to that diligence, Santaquin City now holds a AA+ credit rating from S&P Global. This saves residents thousands of dollars through lower interest rates.

The proposed tax increase would:

- Cost the average household about \$2.23 per month
- Generate \$164,000 annually
- Fund:
 - ½ of a new police officer position
 - ½ of a new firefighter supervisory role
 - A part-time position for our City Library

I'm grateful to those who have already shared their thoughts on this proposal. I've never been more confident in Santaquin's future. Our community is full of hard-working, resilient people—and together, we're building a strong, sustainable future.
