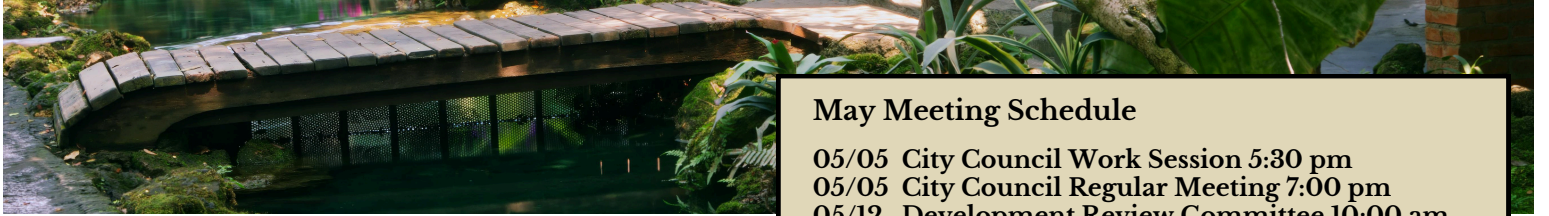

Happy May to all of Santaquin!

It is the first of spring! It's sad to see that our snowpack is mostly gone and, except for the spring snowstorms in the mountains and rain in the valleys, we really have had a poor water year. Right now, we are sitting at just over 50% of where the water from snow would normally be and 50% of the total moisture expected for an average year. We hope and pray for rains to continue for stream flows to help us and the farmers through the rest of this water year. I pray that next year's snow will be better!

As of now, we have our expected secondary reservoirs filling and wells on the ready. In light of the challenges, I suggest that we stay vigilant. Please water as frugally as possible and enjoy the summer. We will keep you informed of our water situation as the irrigation season progresses.

In January of this year, my letter to the City talked of two topics, low snowpack and a new library. Two separate topics, and this month I am revisiting both of those topics. Water has been talked about and now on to the library.

The new Library and Learning Center is moving along as planned. We have most of the inside of the building construction complete. Our construction has been underway for a few months now. We have everything nearly complete including insulation, wiring, HVAC, lighting, tile, and toilets. Soon we'll finish the cabinets, countertops, floors, and the elevator.

The last challenge we have are the furnishings (i.e. shelves, cabinets, and equipment) We are finalizing and finding ways to fund without raising taxes to complete the furnishings. In fact, the entirety of the library has been funded in multiple ways, such as creating an Industrial Park, inviting business, creating new jobs, and adding these exciting improvements.

Additionally, we have had generous donors, including businesses and families, who have stepped up and donated in significant ways to make this happen! To date, we have received nearly \$500,000 in local pledges and donations that have helped to fund the new library.

I want to thank those businesses and families that have provided these funds to make this happen. I also appreciate the creativity of the Council to find ways to fund a massive project like this without dipping into taxpayer funds. Thank you all so much. Look for a future announcement when this new facility will open.

Lastly, I want to point you to the City's recently passed resolution 04-03-2026 honoring Sgt. Bill Hooser (<https://bit.ly/4u6PKYd>). Bill is a great man that we lost way too early in the line of duty. Bill served Santaquin City with the upmost integrity and honor. I encourage each of you to help us honor Bill and his family by serving your friends and neighbors during the month of May.

I now look forward to an incredible May. Please take part in the opportunities that come throughout this month to honor Sgt. Bill Hooser and his family. May we always remember this great human being, his ultimate sacrifice, and his service to this community.
