Fireworks Information

The Santaquin Fire Department would like everyone to have a safe Independence Day and Pioneer Day. Remember that fireworks may only be discharged July 2nd through 5th from 11:00 am to 11:00 pm, and until midnight on the 4th and July 22nd through 25th from 11:00 am to 11:00 pm, and until midnight on the 24th.

Fireworks of all kinds, shapes and sizes are prohibited in ALL areas east of I-15, South and West of Rowley's Red Barn and ALL of Summit Ridge, ALL unincorporated county areas surrounding Santaquin, and any privately owned property that's not your own, orchards, schools, and churches, etc.

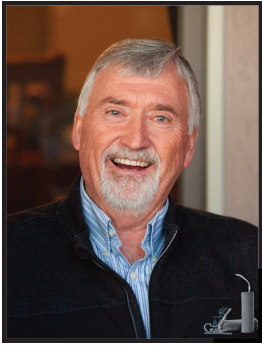

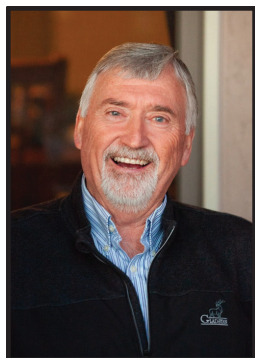

With summer well underway, it is good to know that the high water has finally gone down, and no damages were noted from the runoff. In fact, we had a much higher than normal year of water runoff in our mountains. Most of the town would not have known we had higher than normal flood waters. As a report for those of you who would like to know, Santaquin and Summit Creek Irrigation and Canal Company have contributed to Utah lake and hence to the Great Salt Lake (GSL) with water flows nearing 30 to 45 cubic feet per second from February until nearly the first of June.

From my vantage point, it was wise decision making on the part of the irrigation company that enabled reservoir storage and to fulfill a requested contribution to keeping the GSL alive. In the future, we will need to upgrade the flow channel that goes to Utah Lake. We also await with anticipation, the to be reconstructed flood control basin now under the engineering arm of Utah County. These two future projects will help ensure flood waters do not adversely affect us with flooding whether it is fields, orchards, or roadways.

The construction on Main Street has been a challenge and will continue to be for the rest of this construction season, as the crews finish the work from 300 east to 100 west. When the entire project is finished next year, we will enjoy two lanes of traffic in each direction, a center left turning lane, and parking along Main Street. The new road profile, curb and gutter, and sidewalk will beautify and relieve us of some of our traffic challenges and access to our businesses. Many of the older businesses will be provided with new ADA ramps and new approaches to their buildings to help with improved customer access. It has been unfortunate to see that the construction has discouraged a few of us from going to these businesses. I want to encourage you to make an effort to patronize each business as they contribute so very much to our City. We thank them for bearing with the challenges of construction.

Next year, the Main Street construction will conclude in the fall with Main Street being upgraded to near 600 west. Then we will have a rest for a season before something new will arise.

In the coming months, we have our City celebration, Orchard Days. The parade this year will proceed along 100 south where it has been held in previous years. It will be a challenge, but we will get through this as we meet each challenge and make the best of it.

I thank you for bearing with us and working to make Santaquin better. Remember that in August we will have a new bike skills park at Prospector View Park in Santaquin canyon. By late fall, we will once again have access through all of Santaquin Canyon. It has been 8 years since we enjoyed that drive. I look forward to the upgrades.
