Local Warming Center Program Needs

Warming centers for individuals who are homeless and seeking warmth and a place to stay for the night will be open nightly from 9pm to 8am through April 30, 2025, and will be in Provo and incorporated Utah County. Volunteers (18 years and older) are needed to help at the warming centers during the evening, late night, and early morning. Those serving will be assisting experienced staff with set up, clean-up, safety, and security and will be providing our homeless friends with care and fellowship. Training is required.



Mayor's Newsletter | November 2024



I am writing this letter on the 21st of October in order to have it in your November newsletter. With that, I wanted to give a canyon update. The road, bridges, and repairs of streambanks under the most recently awarded contract have been completed and approved by federal highways and the USFS.

Today (October 21st, 2024), the United States Forest Service awarded a contract extension for the contractor to repair the lowest washout in the

canyon. This work will start tomorrow and is expected to finish right around the first of November. Maybe by then, the Forest Service will allow trips to Tinney's and above until the yearly gate closures. Let's hope for good weather and some later winter snow storms for our water year. It seems opening the canyon was not one of those things that the Forest Service had as a priority for this year. (continued on next page)

I want to remind all that on the evening of November 13th there will be an online open house and on the evening of November 14th, in our City Hall multipurpose room, UDOT will be holding these two open houses with a public hearing. These open houses will begin at 5:30pm. Please check our website at santaquin.org closer to these dates for more details.

UDOT will present their Preferred Alternative plans and get public input on the design and construction for the replacement of our Main Street interchange. So that you know, our interchange is the oldest on the entire I-15 corridor from the Arizona border to the Idaho border. Replacing a 60-year-old structure is important and has taken a lot of time and effort to move us up the prioritization ladder. To have the interchange upgrade and the freeway widened to three-lanes from Payson to south of the Juab County line will be a welcome improvement.

Three years ago, this project was out 20 to 30 years for evaluation. We have moved that needle, and the open house is the next step in getting us up to the Phase I level. At that point, funding can be appropriated. There are still a long list of things to accomplish as we move forward. Please find time to attend either the online or in person public open houses. These open houses are a good time to envision the overall plan. This is a win for our City and a culmination of a lot of work to get to this point.

Please remember to Vote on November 5th. If you want to vote in person, Utah County will be holding in person voting in our City Hall. We have an ADA accessible room where you can vote in person.

Thanks to you all for your support and help as we move our city to a new level. One with many new businesses and more coming. Please support our local businesses as much as possible.

Next year, Main Street will be completed and CUP will have most of its construction behind them. These are certainly all good things for Santaquin for sure.

I hope everyone has a safe and Happy Thanksgiving.
