Santaquin Residents,

September was a month to remember! I first want to say a heartfelt thank you to our firefighters here in Santaquin and surrounding areas. It's a scary thing to watch rising smoke and to see flames on the mountains in our town and neighboring communities. We are so fortunate that we did not have any evacuations here in Santaquin. An event like this reminds us what a fantastic team of first responders we have. Whether they are from the city, county or Wildland firefighters, their response was nothing less than miraculous. They put themselves on the front line to protect lives and property. They came when we needed them most. While we all hoped that we would never have to face and event like this again, it is amazing to

watch these people come together for a common purpose. We are grateful to all those who responded to the fires. It could have been so much worse had it not been for the heroic actions of our first responders. We thank you from the depths of our hearts.

I want to also thank the community for coming together to help support our firefighters. They received more than enough supplies, food and beverages within a day of the initial fire. We had groups bringing in hot meals, treats, signs and cards. The response from our citizens was overwhelming.

It was a good reminder to always be prepared. Natural disasters as well as personal hardships can happen anytime. I heard so many stories of prior preparation from evacuees in Elk Ridge and Woodland Hills that was crucial to them during the fire. Now is the time to prepare and make a plan.

It is times like these that really show the heart of a community. It was scary, we were unsure and it was difficult to know just how to help and prepare, but we did it together. I am so proud of Santaquin. We have heart and you all proved it during the fires and I truly believe we are stronger for it.

I also wanted to address the Town Hall meeting planned for the parkway extension. There was an engineering delay, therefore that meeting will likely be held the first part of November. Watch for notices on our city website and via Facebook pages.

Thank you again for all that you do to make Santaquin a better place!

Youth Sports

WRESTLING: Program will start mid-November and run through mid-December with matches on a week night. Grades Preschool-6th. Early Registration 8/30-9/10 (\$35). Regular Registration 9/11-10/8 (\$40) or until full. \$10 late fee after 10/8. T-shirt included. Wrestling singlet, shoes and headgear are encouraged. Volunteer coaches are needed.



VOLLEYBALL: Program will start mid-November and run through mid-December with games being on a week night. Grades 3rd-9th. Early Registration 8/30-9/10 (\$30-\$35). Regular Registration 9/11-10/8 (\$35-\$40) or until full. \$10 late fee will apply after 10/8. Parent volunteers and officials needed. T-shirt included.

JR JAZZ BASKETBALL: Early Registration: 10/1-10/22 (\$25-\$45). Regular Registration 10/23-11/5 (\$30-\$50) or until full. \$10 late fee will apply after 11/5. Volunteer coaches and paid officials needed.

- 1st/2nd Graders will participate in a developmental co-ed league that will meet 6 times **on a week night**. Season will start in January and consist of approx. a 20 minute practice and 20 minutes of game scrimmage with another team. Parent volunteers needed to coach.
- 3rd-8th Graders will have league play and will be drafted into teams. Practices will start in December. The season will start in January and run through February with games being on Saturdays between 8am-4pm* (1 game and practice per week) 7 games total. For teams that qualify in grades 7th/8th, there will be a post league tournament. Parent volunteers needed for head coach position.
