City Office Closure




The City Offices will be **closed on Monday, October 14th** for Columbus Day. We will re-open the following day at 9 am.

Municipal Election

Santaquin City will be holding a Municipal Election on November 5, 2019. At this time there will be three 4-year Council seats vacant. To **mail** in your ballot, it must be postmarked by November 4, 2019. You may also drop your ballot in a ballot drop box at the City Office. You can expect your ballot to arrive between October 15-22.

General election information is found at vote.utah.gov. The Santaquin City Offices will be used as the polling place for the General Election if you do not mail in your ballot. The City Offices are located at 275 W Main, Santaquin, UT. You can also contact the Utah County Elections office at 801-851-8128 with any questions.

Tonya Hamby won the Hidden Picture Contest! Her name was randomly drawn from all of the entrants. Congratulations Tonya!


